ABOUT US

OUR REGION

Compton Unified School District is located in the south-central region of Los Angeles County, California. CUSD encompasses the City of Compton and portions of the cities of Carson and Los Angeles. The district currently serves nearly 24,000 students at 36 sites and is in the midst of a dramatic turnaround, marked by increases in student achievement rates, a graduation rate nearing 90% dramatic facilities improvements, and a focus on STEAM throughout all schools. The mission of the Compton Unified School District is to empower individuals to lead, staff to teach, and scholars to learn by fostering an environment that encourages engagement and teachers to be visionary, innovative and accountable for the achievement of all scholars. The spirit of continuous improvement and a growth mindset are critical to building positive school communities.

OUR SCHOOL

Compton Senior High School is a comprehensive four-year public high school enrolling approximately 1,245 students in grades 9 through 12, plus the Alternative School Program via Cesar Chavez HS. The school opened in 1896 and graduated its first senior class in 1898. Compton High School is currently located at Roosevelt Middle School until the new school is completed. Completion date is approximately January 2025. 100% of the students receive Free/Reduced Lunch. Compton High School is accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC) and holds membership in the College Board.

OUR CURRICULUM

The academic program is organized on a 7 period block schedule as of the 20-21 school year. Thirty-five (35) credits per semester is the maximum course load; scholars take 3-1 hour 38-minute classes four days a week and 1-51 minute course daily. 13 AP® courses are offered: Art History, Biology, Computer Science Principles, English Language, English Literature, Environmental Science, Government, Psychology, U.S. History, World History, Art 2-D, Drawing, and AP Spanish Language. AP is an open-enrollment program. Honors classes are offered in English I & II (Pre-AP est. 2022), Integrated Math 1, 2, & 3, Pre-Calculus, Math & Statistics (TCMS), Economics, Biology, and Chemistry. *Honors placement is open enrollment.

RANK AND GPA CALCULATION

Class Rank is exact and includes weighted grade point average. GPA is calculated using the following quality points: A=4.0 (Excellent), B=3.0 (Above Average), C=2.0 (Average), D=1.0 (Below Average), and F=0.0 (Fail). Beginning with grade 9, all subjects, whether passed or failed, are included in the calculation. Each scholar must also complete a minimum of 220 credits in designated areas required for graduation. AP, Honors, and Community College classes are weighted by one point. Grades are recorded on the transcript and grade point average are computed in December and June. NC/CR grades are not included in the GPA.

CLASS OF 2023

There are 226 students in the Class of 2023. Below is the GPA distribution for the Class of 2023 as of August 2023.

- 15 earned a 4.0+
- 25 earned 3.5–3.99
- 44 earned 3.0–3.49
- 68 earned 2.50–2.99
- 42 earned 2.0–2.49
- 32 earned less than a 2.0

ADVANCED PLACEMENT RESULTS

- In May 2023, approximately 236 students took AP Exams.
- A total of 368 exams were taken in 13 subjects.
- 26% of the AP Exams received scores of 3 or higher

POSTSECONDARY PLACEMENT

- Approximately 44% are expected to enroll in 4-year colleges and/or universities
- Approximately 40% are expected to enroll in 2-year institutions
- Approximately 16% selected work, military service, technical instruction, unknown
