Pledge of Allegiance- The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Calva Jones the Opaa! Director of Nutrition Services for West Plains Schools. Food Service Update-

Preliminary Annual Performance Report -

Dr. Julie Thompson presented a summary of student performance released on the 2012 APR report. She reported that the district met all 14 standards in 2011-12 on the APR. This marks the sixth year in a row that the school district has achieved this recognition.

Capital Improvements Update-

Dr. Mulford indicated that all capital improvement projects around the district should all be complete by mid-September with the exception of the roof replacement for the Administration Building. Completed projects include – Middle School Pavilion; renovations to the West Plains Elementary Library and office; South Fork playground retaining wall; field renovation at high school, replace scoreboard at Zizzer Stadium, seal and stripe asphalt at South Fork, Elementary, Middle and High Schools; minor landscaping at elementary and middle schools; Thornburg campus phase 1- nearing completion; Howell street renovations for ALC; Science Lab updates at high school; parking lot at South Fork.
