

10TH GRADE – MAIN FOCUS

- All students are different and all can succeed
- Rigorous and balanced course schedule
- Stay involved (clubs, sports, etc.)
- Community service in areas of interest
- Strengthen study skills
- Discover and pursue a passion area
- Start researching and visiting colleges
- Practice ACT in October
- National College Fair-Seattle (October 6th and 7th)

11TH GRADE – MAIN FOCUS

- Continue in rigorous and balanced program
- PSAT October, during school day
- Community service
- Continue working in Naviance
- College rep visits, opportunity to ask admission questions, National College Fair
- Juniors meet with counselor during registration
- SAT/ACT student signs up in spring on-line
- Continue researching post-secondary options:
 - 4-year colleges, 2-year community/technical colleges, other experiences, military, gap year...
- Visit! Visit! Visit! Colleges and programs

12TH GRADE MAIN FOCUS

- Colleges emphasize rigorous and balanced senior schedule
- Complete all graduation requirements
- Post-high school planning refine focus and plan
- College applications starting in the fall
- Apply for financial aid/scholarships
- Retake SAT/ACT if needed in the fall (no more than twice)
- College visits (overnight stays and tours)
- Create a resume to prepare for employment
- Celebrate Graduation!

Electives	7	3.5
Total	48	24

*The Science requirement of 3.0 credits must include two lab classes.

**The Fine Arts requirement of 2.0 credits can include 1 credit of Personalized Pathway Requirement (PPR).

*** For World Language, both credits can be substituted for a PPR.

*****Washington State History is a graduation requirement, taken in 7th & 8th grade in the BSD. Students who transfer in after 7th grade are required to take WSH.

BSD HIGH SCHOOL OVERALL GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

- 24 Credits (28 Credits Possible)
- 3rd credit of science and 3rd credit of math are chosen by the student based on their High School and Beyond Plan
- Personal Pathway Requirement (PPR) 3 courses that lead to specific post H.S. career or educational outcomes; part of the High School and Beyond Plan
- 2.0 Minimum GPA
- 40 Hours Community Service
- Meet Standard on State Assessments or Alternatives

SUPER WEDNESDAY OCTOBER 11, 2023

9th Grade

- Participate in High School and Beyond Plan activities. 9th graders should be in their assigned room by 8:00am and will be done by 10:00am.
- What to Bring: Laptop, charger and earbuds/headphones
- For 9th and 10th graders who have a need to stay at school, there will be some supervised common spaces.

11th Grade

- Take the Digital PSAT/NMQST (Practice SAT and National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test). 11th graders should be in their assigned room by 8:00am
- What to Bring: Laptop, charger and earbuds/headphones, #2 pencil and Calculator. 4-function, scientific, and graphic calculators are permitted. Cell Phones/Tablets/smartwatches may not be used. Optional: watch with no audible alarm.
- Students will download the software needed to test at school in the week prior to the exam.
- The official SAT exam will be offered to 11th graders at some point during the spring. Date is To Be Determined.
 - o PSAT will take from 8am- 11:15 am

10th Grade

- Participate in High School and Beyond Plan activities and Healthy Youth Survey. 10th graders should be in their assigned room by 8:00am and will be done by 10:00 am.
- What to Bring: Laptop, charger and earbuds/headphones
- For 9th and 10th graders who have a need to stay at school, there will be some supervised common spaces.

12th Grade

- **Option 1:** Independently pursue their own interests such as community service projects, working on college applications, etc.
- Option 2: Take the official SAT. To register students complete this form <u>https://forms.office.com/r/ywByt48d4r</u>. They do <u>not</u> need to register with the College Board to take this test. Seniors should be in their assigned room by 8:00am. SAT testing will happen in the gym area. Additional details will be sent to those who register.
- **Option 3:** Work on College Essays with a staff member in the Library. Students can sign up for this using a link found in a separate email to be sent by School Counselors.

WHAT IS NAVIANCE?

- Our web-based tool for students & parents
- Freshman students will use Naviance for career & college research and to complete their High School and Beyond Plan (HSBP)
- We work with the middle school to continue curriculum started there
- Students will learn more about themselves through surveys in Naviance
- Set personalized goals
- Explore career options
- Search for colleges
- Apply for scholarships
- Track admissions status
- Enter their Community Service hours
- Find info about upcoming news & events

COMMUNITY SERVICE HOUR REPORTING

- x2vol access via Naviance
- Student enters volunteer hours and supervisor email contact
- Afterwards the supervisor will receive an automatic email requesting them to verify the student's hours they volunteered.
- The school counseling secretary will approve hours after verification has been received.

The Counseling Secretary, Ms. Huynh can answer any questions your student has concerning Community Service Hours.

AP TEST REGISTRATION



During the 2023-2024 School Year

- First couple weeks of class: Teachers will give students a join code for each of their AP classes. Students use their College Board username and password and join code to enroll in their class section.
- September and October: Students complete registration for exams and payment for exams.

Fall Registration	Deadline to order AP Exam is Nov. 15	\$94
Late Registration	Ordered Nov. 16– Mar 13	\$94 + \$40 fee

There will be a late registration fee of \$40 for each exam ordered after November 15th.
