

WHAT IS CLASS ACT?



CLASS Act Overview



Clayton County Public Schools (CCPS) has selected vendors to provide supplemental instruction as tutoring, after school programs, and homework assistance to students in grades kindergarten through 12th who have been identified as having deficiencies in reading, writing, English/Language Arts, Math, Science, and/or Social Studies for CCPS.

- All students have a **\$1,000** stipend to utilize through one of the CCPS vendors chosen by their parents or guardians.
- Students will be able to take advantage of meeting with their tutor via virtual, face to face or hybrid platforms.
- Tutors are available after school and during the weekend.
- Vendors will provide resources and learning tools needed to provide tutoring and/or homework assistance to students.
- Vendors will provide progress reports to parents on a regular basis that documents the use of the services. Information may include the types of services rendered, time of services rendered, and how the student is progressing in specific academic areas.

Who's eligible for CLASS Act?

All students, kindergarten through 12 grade, enrolled in the district's traditional and charter schools.



What content areas will be covered?

Depending on the chosen vendor, students are able to receive assistance in Reading/ELA, Math, Science and/or Social Studies.

ENROLLMENT/REGISTRATION PROCESS



CLASS Act Application

Parents can receive a paper application from their school's Parent Liaison. Parents have the option to complete and return the application to their school or to the CCPS Federal Programs office located at 1058 Fifth Avenue; Jonesboro, Georgia 30236. Within the application they must determine their top 3 choices of vendors ranked in order, and provide permission for student achievement levels and scores to be shared with their choice of vendor.

Last date to submit application: March 27, 2024

Last day that services can be rendered: May 21, 2024

The Class ACT team will:

- Verify each student's eligibility status**
- Submit approved vendor request forms to provider with the parent's contact information and student test scores, then the approved vendor will contact the parent to discuss a tutoring schedule that meets their needs.**
- **Please note: Students may NOT exceed their \$1000 stipend allotment. Parents will NOT have direct contact with the stipend funds, instead all stipends will be paid through a district to vendor direct pay process.**
