## Introduction

Welcome to The Paragon School!

The Paragon is a vibrant, welcoming and inclusive school for children aged 3 to 11, with approx. 250 on roll, including approximately 50 EYFS / Pre-school children.

The Paragon School is located within the Widcombe area of Bath and is situated on Lyncombe Vale, a residential road to the south of Bath city centre. Lyncombe Vale is accessed via Ralph Allen Drive which links to Ralph Allen Drive / Prior Park Road (A3062) to Combe Down and Lyncombe Vale Road which provides access to Greenway lane and thence Wellsway (A367).



## Purpose

The purpose of this Handbook is to support members of staff and families who are joining the school as well as visitors and contractors travel to and from The Paragon safely, conveniently, with due regard for our local neighbours and School Travel Plan Aims.

Thank you for taking the time to read this handbook, we hope it is helpful as you plan your journey to the school or consider the transport arrangements available should your family be joining the school community.

### Section 5 - The Paragon School Travel Plan Aims & Objectives

*The Paragon School is committed to engaging with all stakeholders in pursuit of congestion reduction and safer roads in the local area, greater uptake of sustainable modes of transport and increasingly active & healthy travel by the school community. We will achieve these aims by committing:*

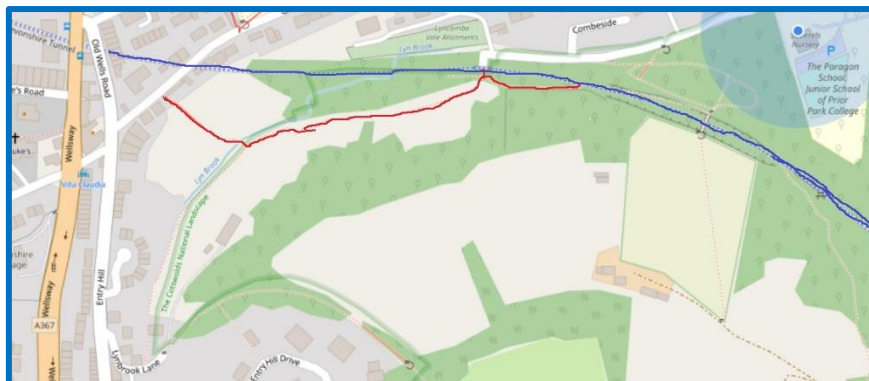
- ◆ To understand modes of transport currently used by the school community for their daily journeys to and from school.
- ◆ To understand and exploit the range of sustainable transport modes available to the school community currently and, as far as possible, in the future.
- ◆ To maximise the number of staff, parents and children adopting sustainable modes of transport for their school commute; including walking, cycling, car-sharing and minibus usage.
- ◆ To reduce barriers to walking and cycling faced by The Paragon and local community by engaging with the local community & Local Authority to improve walking & cycling routes in the local area.
- ◆ To have a positive impact on the health and wellbeing of The Paragon staff, children and parents by supporting active travel.
- ◆ To have a positive impact on the local environment including traffic congestion in the areas around The Paragon by encouraging empathetic road usage by members of the Paragon community and local community.
- ◆ To provide The Paragon School staff, parents and visitors with high quality and relevant transport information including sustainable transport opportunities.
- ◆ To harness the measures above to reduce the number of vehicular journeys to / from The Paragon School.

### Travelling to The Paragon School

#### Pedestrian

The Paragon School lies 1.3 - 1.5 miles by foot south of Bath city centre. This route is mostly flat, with a steep uphill / downhill walk via Lyncombe Hill (1.1 miles) or a more gradual uphill walk via Prior Park Road and Lyncombe Vale.

Located on Lyncombe Vale, The Paragon School is within easy pedestrian and cycle access of the city centre. Pedestrians can also walk to the school from the Wellsway / Entry Hill area of the city via the vehicle free path as shown below.

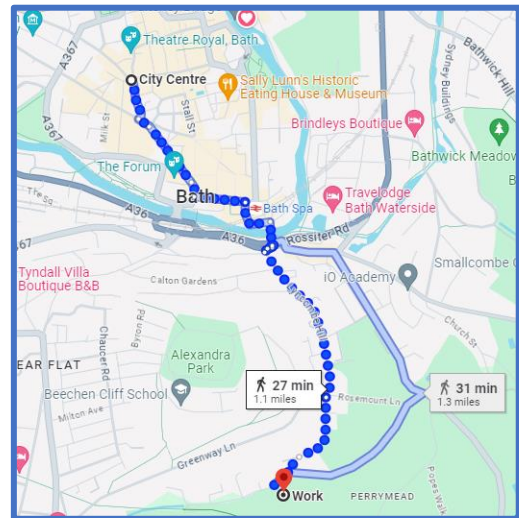


The Two Tunnels Cycle path is accessible via an unofficial path from the end of Lyncombe Vale which is unsurfaced and bordered with barbed wire and should be navigated with caution. Pedestrian access to The Paragon is gained via either the dedicated pedestrian gate at opposite Lyncombe Hill Road or the vehicular gate (and dedicated pedestrian path) from Lyncombe Vale.

### Public Transport - Bus

The nearest bus stops to The Paragon School are located on Ralph Allen Drive (Perrymead Bus Stops), close to the junction with Perrymead & Prior Park Road. This is approximately 650 meters (8 minutes) walk along the picturesque Lyncombe Vale.

Commuters arriving at Bath Spa train station (see below) can undertake the 13 minute journey via the First Bus service from Dorchester Street to Perrymead at regular intervals. Those travelling from Bath City Centre should also take the service from Dorchester Street to Perrymead and walk along the picturesque Lyncombe Vale for 2 minutes to reach The Paragon School.

### Public Transport – Rail

Bath Spa train station (situated on the GWR mainline) lies approximately 0.6 miles from The Paragon.

## By Road

Those traveling to The Paragon School are reminded to adhere to the speed restrictions and drive with due care and respect for fellow road users (vehicles & bicycles), pedestrians and local residents. Those traveling to / from The Paragon School during peak times (8:00am – 9:00am & 3:15pm-4:30pm) are asked to observe the unofficial one way system agreed with the local community to minimise conflict between opposing traffic on the relatively narrow roads surrounding the school site. Parents are advised to access the site from Prior Park Road via Lyncombe Vale and to return to Prior Park Road via Lyncombe Vale Road and Rosemount Lane, forming a clockwise circuit.

## Staff

Staff bringing vehicles onsite are asked to register their vehicle details with Reception. This will be added to the ANPR system which controls the entrance gates. All staff are encouraged and supported to adopt sustainable travel whenever possible. Staff are encouraged to car share whenever possible.

Prior Park Schools is a member of the Cycle to Work Scheme. All colleagues are able to access the financial advantages of purchasing bicycles via this scheme. [The UK's Most Popular Cycle to Work Benefit - Cyclescheme](#). Cycle storage is available onsite. As part of the proposed building development it is hoped that further secure storage will be created as well as shower facilities.

## Visitors

Visitors are warmly welcomed to The Paragon. Those visiting by car are asked to confirm their arrival time, share any accessibility concerns and book a Visitor Parking Bay with the Reception Team ([office.tps@priorparkschools.com](mailto:office.tps@priorparkschools.com)).

## Contractors / Service Vehicles

Contractors working on site should liaise with the Estates Manager ([mcrudge@priorparkschools.com](mailto:mcrudge@priorparkschools.com)) regarding access times and vehicle movements. Contractors should note that, due to the location and limitations of the exit gate from The Paragon, large and service vehicles exit the site via the entrance drive by which they arrived onsite.

## Parents

The Paragon actively supports parents and families to adopt sustainable modes of transport whenever possible.

### Park & Stride

Those traveling to The Paragon for morning drop-off and afternoon pick-up are welcome to park their vehicles at Prior Park Garden Centre and walk the remaining ½ mile distance to school. ### Complimentary Minibus Shuttle Service

Prior Park Schools also offer a pre-bookable complimentary shuttle service between Prior Park College and The Paragon School. This service is available to all The Paragon children. ### Walking Bus

The Paragon School aims to work in partnership with the parental community to support active travel. The community has identified two favourable routes by which we aim Walking Buses to walk children to school. (These are from Entry Hill and Widcombe / Prior Park Garden Centre). The

parental community has identified volunteers to act as co-ordinators for the two routes who will work with the parental community to run the Walking Buses effectively and safely. Prior Park Schools has committed to supporting the implementation of Walking Buses with H&S training, financing DBS clearance and creating and implementing suitable Risk Assessments.
