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Informational Item-Flexibility and Meeting Norms:

- The RHS SGC meeting norms as listed at the end of the meeting agenda were reviewed. The council was reminded about appropriate meeting communication and meeting norms.

Public Comment:

- Lee Hills thanked the council for continuing to fund Kit Cummings' program initiative for our students at the school. They are working on a calendar for implementation now. They recently participated in a Zoom meeting and participants who went through the program provided insight into their experience. Coaches from KSU as well as Coach Clack from Milton High School offered their insight as well. They received good feedback from parents.

Student Update: None

Principal Update:

- **Summative Saturday Feedback**
 - Last Saturday was the first Saturday session used to clear incompletes.
 - 80 incompletes were cleared by 66 students.
 - There are 108 students signed up for the upcoming Saturday.
 - We are waiting for the bill for the busses for Saturday school and will share that information when we get it.
 - We can talk about continuing this program for the new school year.
- **Mission and Value Statement Feedback**
 - Surveys were sent out to the leadership team and we came up with a draft mission statement.
 - The draft will be sent out to the community next week for feedback.
 - This work on the mission and value statements have lead to some grad clarify conversations. It looks like we can come to a great consensus on the RHS Mission and Vision.
- **General Principal's Update**
 - Spring sports are currently underway. Boys and girls soccer, tennis, track, and golf are all doing well. Dr. Shaw is proud of all of the coaches and the athletes and all of the work that they are putting in, especially considering all of the challenges that Covid has posed.
 - Band and Chorus have big competitions coming up. They will have to record their performances instead of traveling this year.
 - Graduation ceremony planning is underway. Students will likely be allowed 2-3 tickets per family. They are struggling to handle logistics due to Covid restrictions. We are planning for a full graduation, hopefully.
 - We are having a senior prom, to be held outside. Only in-school seniors are invited to participate.

Discussion Items:

- **Update on Power of Peace**

- The plan is for Kit to address students, possibly in April. We are looking at dates in April to replace SSS lessons
 - Kit prefers to start with athletes because they tend to have influence in the school, however the intent is to expand the program.
 - Milton and Roswell are coming together to work on this initiative to help the students.
 - The cost of POPP is \$4,000. We will get the remainder of the \$7,500 that we approved for the program back in our budget.
- **Additional Funding Ideas**
 - There is approximately \$9,000 left in the council budget. We do not have an exact number because a few items are still up in the air.
 - Val suggested that we use some funds to schedule an additional Saturday session to catch any additional students who need to avoid or clear incompletes. Dr. Shaw said that this is doable because the Saturday Session logistics are already set up. We are just waiting on the cost of the busses.
 - Additional ideas included SAT prep, free tutoring, career support for our students, supplies of the 3D printers.
 - We do not have anything specific to vote on at the meeting regarding the remaining funds. When we have a more specific final amount of money remaining in the budget, we will be able to make a more informed decision.

Discussion Item-SGC Elections:

- SGC elections start today. One teacher, Angela Hornsby has volunteered.
- In order to make parents more aware of the elections and to encourage them to vote, we can post information on our social media accounts, post information on the new marquee, and possibly pass out fliers in the carpool lines before and/or after school. We can also do a robo call to remind parents to vote.

Budget and Finance Committee Update:

- The SGC received a thank you card from Mr. Moon and the band for the funds that he received from the SGC.
