Public comment:

- Beth Grey recently went to a meeting with Katha Stuart and she mentioned a personal finance class. Milton HS has this course already. She feels it would be a very important course for students to have to be successful. Mrs. Grey feels that students should have the opportunity to develop practical knowledge related to finance. She feels that this is something that students will need to understand as they move into adulthood.
- Mrs. Grey took a picture of the course proposal from the personal financial literacy class at Milton. She handed out copies of the course description.
- She would like to propose this class so that kids understand every day financial skills.
 These are basic skills that she feels students would be interested in taking.
- Lashonta Flemister mentioned the finance course that is already preapproved by the DOE. There is a course that is available to be taught related to finance.
- Fred Barth expressed his appreciation for the events that have been held recently regarding mental health. He applauds the efforts of all involved.

Student update:

- Regarding the recent news article, students are concerned about the consequences for those involved.
- Some people are inquiring about the outcome. Dr. Shaw said that the school has done
 what they are required to do. The issue was turned over to Roswell police and they will
 be handling the matter from this point forward. The school is limited in what they can do
 with this issue. This is something that occurred off campus.
- The new letter for graduation will be coming out soon with an updated dress code for graduation.

Principal Update:

- \$24,900 This was the bid we recently received for the sign. There were some concerns
 with the vendor. The bid came in very low in comparison to other vendors and we wanted
 to do more looking into this option. We want to make sure that we will be receiving what
 we envisioned.
- It will require \$38,077 to purchase an additional bilingual liaison for our school.
- Skills USA RHS had a lot of first place prizes at this CTAE competition, especially in broadcasting.
- Jessi Kirtley has been nominated for a Shuler Hensley Award for Best Actress

- RHS had the state champions for girls trio
- JROTC Going to nationals in D.C.
- Lacrosse Boys' Varsity should win the area
- Soccer, Track Doing great
- Tennis Play for the region tomorrow
- Gymnastics has won first place in several meets
- Baseball- has partnered with Centennial to benefit the Roswell Recreation Department.
 The proceeds from concessions sales are being donated to the youth league at the Roswell Rec. Dept. They are also doing an equipment donation drive when they play.

Budget and Finance Committee Update:

 The applications have gone out. We have only received one application so far and hope to receive more.

Strategic Flexible Funding Update:

- We need a bit more money to cover the additional bilingual liaison position. We have already set aside \$25,000, but we will need additional funds to cover this position.
- We need to approve an additional \$13,000. We do have some funds that can be moved around based on the cost of the sign.

Amy Jewett made a motion to vote to approve this expenditure.

Strategic Plan Indicators Review and Discussion:

- We will be looking first into the area of student achievement.
- We have had discussions about the "complete RHS Hornet experience"- We said that we
 would like 80% of students to complete either academic pathways, work-based learning,
 or TAG internships, but counselors have said this is not something that is measurable.
- How do we measure this outcome? Should we revise this and have the county approve the revision?
- Pathway Completion is a part of CCRPI.
- 76.65% is our overall completion rate for academic pathways. 57.11% is the percentage for AP Pathways, 29.3% for CTAE, 23.78% for Fine Arts, and 25.05% for World Language.
- We will work from the baseline of 76.65%. We will measure growth from this number.
- "Positive Hornet Progress"- We can't seem to find a baseline for this outcome either.
- Critical SGC Student Achievement- We are offering the credit repair program for students who fail core subjects between 60-69. We are offering extended credit repair in Algebra I and Geometry. We are increasing the capacity of the credit recovery lab,

- offering after-school ESOL tutoring, a school registrar position, and counselors are introducing pathways to incoming students.
- We need to complete PSAT/SAT professional development.
- We have a graduation rate committee, but it has shifted into discussion about culture, strategies, and study hall / remediation. They have identified several key focus areas. This group would like to revamp study hall. Our SST chair, Erika Zeidler has been pulling some kids to complete work during study hall.
- School Performance Report; Graduation Rate: 88.7%
- Amy did not feel we could cancel any of our upcoming meetings. So, we will proceed
 with the meetings that are currently on the schedule.











Percent of students scoring in each performance level on 2018 Georgia Milestones




Biology

Percent of students scoring in each performance level on 2018 Georgia Milestones




Coordinate Algebra/Algebra I

Percent of students scoring in each performance level on 2018 Georgia Milestones




US History

Percent of students scoring in each performance level on 2018 Georgia Milestones




College & Career Readiness

Percent of 12th grade students who are college and career ready




Four-Year Graduation Rate
