 Describe the proposed concept and the target population (grade, subgroup, etc.).
 Explain the need that the concept addresses, and describe how your concept meets this need. Northview HS desires to enhance instructional delivery in support of career connections and authentic learning experiences. It is our goal to fully prepare our students for the most prominent and successful positions our global economy has to offer.

Offering a few specific courses in an arena/lecture-style model (with larger class sizes) allows us to meet two goals: (1) allow more students to take the courses; and (2) prepare students for success in the academic experiences they will encounter in college by allowing them to experience seminar-style courses while in high school.

Northview requests a waiver of the district rules for class size to allow a few, select courses to be offered arena-style with a class size of 50+ students. Northview aims to use the large lecture model for 2 courses: AP Psychology and Social Issues & Media.

2) Include any research or evidence that the concept will positively affect your school's student population. If no research exists, please articulate the rationale for the likelihood of success of the concept, and describe your plans for risk mitigation. Beyond their high-school graduation, all beginning college students face enormous challenges, ranging from the academic to the social, and the first year of college marks the period of greatest vulnerability for student attrition (Feldman and Zimbler, 2011). Research has found that 28 percent of first-year students in four-year colleges do not return for their sophomore year. The reasons students struggle in their college experience are many:

- Students are simply not intellectually or cognitively ready for the challenges of college work.
- Students lack basic skills that lead to success in college, such as time management, writing ability, effective reading strategies, note-taking skills, and knowledge of test-taking strategies.
- Students often experience large classes, in which they may experience anonymity and a sense
 of disconnection from their instructor (Feldman and Zimbler, 2011).



While Northview High School students traditionally experience a high level of success in high school and beyond, this research supports the need for our school to continually enhance the experiences we provide to prepare students for college success. Adding a lecture-style college-level course to our current academic offerings will allow our students to learn the skills needed to be successful in this setting, and will serve as one additional tool equipping Northview graduates for future success.
