REGISTRATION REMINDER

Kindergarten Registration for 24-25 School Year will open on March 4th, 2024. The window will remain open until March 22nd, 2024. Any child who will be 5 years old by September 1, 2024 is eligible to enter kindergarten for the 2024/2025 school year.

Starting on Monday, March 4th, 2024, you can register your child online at https://www.tvsd.org/registration. During the online registration process you will be asked to upload and/or submit your child's birth certificate, two proofs of residence, and your child's current immunization record. If you have lost or misplaced your child's birth certificate, now is the time to apply for a duplicate copy. If you have any issues uploading the required documentation, you may send it directly to the elementary office by emailing the building secretary.

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
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
