





Maryland High School Diploma Requirements

A minimum of 22 credits.

17 of these credits must be in the following subjects:

- 4 credits English
- 2 credits French
- 2 credits in Social Studies (1 credit in U.S. History)
- 6 credits in Math and Science (including at least 2 in Science and 2 in Math)
- 2 credits in a 3rd language
- 1 credit in Physical Education
- + 5 elective units from any curricular area.



University recognition



The FB/BFI & the IB Diploma recognize students' level of achievement and completion of a challenging program.

It opens the doors of universities worldwide.

However, each university, regardless of the diploma, has specific admission criteria. It is important to check with your university counselors.

Research



As part of the MYP, students conduct several projects including one mandatory Personal Project completed in 2nde/10th Grade. The project amounts for a recommended 25 hours of research and is presented in a 15-pages report sent to the IB.



Service as Action

Students need to complete some service each year of the program.

IB MYP Languages



Languages "A"? Languages "B"?

All IB language courses aim to develop students skills in listening, writing, speaking, and reading

The IB MYP offers two types of language courses to suit a student's language profile



A. Language & Literature courses:

critical, creative, personal approaches to studying and analyzing literary and non-literary texts (in a student's best or second best language)



B. Language Acquisition courses:

comfort and autonomy, and knowledge of the culture (in a student's second best or another language)

At Rochambeau, each student will study **3 languages**



How to choose?

- INQUIRE about courses offered in each track (content, programs, expectations, grading, exams...)
- DISCUSS with your teachers, your guidance counselors, juniors and seniors
- REFLECT on your plans for the future, but also your profile and your academic results.

No good or bad diploma.

It is about choosing the program that best suits a student's interests, academic results, and project. A program where they will succeed the best.
