What is Title I?

Title I is the oldest and largest federally funded program. WMS receives these supplemental funds to meet the **educational needs** of our students to **close the achievement gap** and enable the students to meet the state's **challenging** academic standards.



How are Title I Funds Used at WMS?

- School Psychologist provides services to students experiencing trauma, funded at 20%.
- Teacher On Special Assignment enhances the school culture and climate. Develops student agency and builds capacity in our students as leaders funded at 100%.
- The Assistant Principal provides supplemental math professional development and targeted support to math teachers funded at 20%.
- Parent Facilitator supports parents in increasing their participation and engagement in school. Engages with community groups to provide integrative support services to our WMS community, which is funded at 50%.
- Professional development for teachers to analyze student data, plan, and create action plans for instructional implementation.
- Educational Programs for Students
