

General Guidelines for Behavior

- Follow instructions given by teachers and staff members.
- Use appropriate language and tone when communicating with others.
- Refrain from disruptive behavior that hinders the learning environment.
- Practice kindness (remember your Kindness Pledge).
- Adhere to the school's policy on bullying, harassment, and violence.

Anti-Bullying Policy

- Bullying of others is strictly prohibited.
- Immediately report situations where you feel unsafe.
- When someone is not nice to you or is bullying you, practice STOP/WALK/TALK.
 Tell the other student, "Please STOP".
 WALK away from the situation.
 TALK to an adult if you need help.

Classroom Rules

- Follow instructions given by your teachers.
- Raise your hand before speaking or leaving your seat.
- Use classroom materials and technology responsibly.
- Keep your workspace/desk clean and organized.
- Show respect and consideration for other students' learning.

Academics

It is each students responsibility to complete their own work Cheating is included but not limited to.

- Copying, in part or whole, from another's quiz, test, paper, assignment, research or creative project, or the like and/or submitting as one's own work a quiz, test, assignment, research or creative project, information which has been purchased, borrowed, or stolen.
- Communicating with another student during a quiz or test.
- Copying the work or portions of the work of another (be it another student, published materials, or internet sources) without citing the source.
- Paraphrasing the work of another or taking an original idea of another and presenting it as one's own work without citing the source.

Digital Responsibilities

- Use technology responsibly and follow the school's acceptable use policy (Remember the Chromebook Agreement signed by you and your parents).
- Keep your hands off of someone else's Chromebook.
- Avoid cyberbullying, harassment, or inappropriate online behavior.
- Report any concerns or incidents to a trusted adult or school staff member.
- Use school-provided technology resources for educational purposes only.

- No personal electronic devices are allowed, unless given permission by teacher.
- Respect copyright laws when using technology.

Cell Phone Policy

• Students are permitted to bring a cell phone to school but it must be shut off during the school day and stored in a backpack. Students may turn their phones on after the end of the school day. Phones that are turned on will be taken by staff and parents will have to come to the school office to retrieve the phone. Continued violation of our cell phone policy will result in disciplinary actions and possible revocation of the privilege to bring a phone to school.

Searches of Desks and Backpacks

School desks and storage areas are school property, which the school has made available for student use for educational purposes. School officials have the right to inspect the desks and storage areas as deemed necessary. Student backpacks will be searched when there is reasonable suspicion that the search will result in the discovery of:

- substances prohibited by district/school policy and or prohibited by state law
- any material or item which presents a danger of physical harm to self or others
- materials not properly in the possession of the student (stolen items)
- any item that falls out of line of school policy (i.e. toys, gum, cell phones, electronic devices etc.)

Personal Belongings

Students should not bring valuables and/or toys to school. Items having value for one individual usually have an attractive appeal for others and unfortunately sometimes disappear. The school cannot be responsible for these items. Teachers may have a special celebration which allows students to bring in a favorite game, stuffed animal, etc. but please remember, at no time is it appropriate for students to bring toy guns, toy knives, or toy weapons of any kind.

Prohibited Items

Students are not allowed to bring any item to school that could cause harm to self or to others. Items that could scare another student are also prohibited from being brought to school. This includes anything sharp or anything that looks like any type of weapon. Any item used outside of its scope as a weapon, will be classified as a weapon for discipline purposes.

Students are not allowed to chew gum or chew on seeds. Electronic games, toys, cameras, trading cards (Digimon, Pokemon, etc.) are not allowed at school.

At Sunset Ridge PK-8, we furnish playground equipment for all grades (basketballs, 4-square balls, jump ropes, tetherball, soft footballs etc). Students are not to bring play items to school because we cannot be responsible for lost or stolen personal belongings.

Items/toys that are prohibited include:

- Toy weapons of any kind
- Footballs, soccer balls, basketballs etc. unless approved by Mr. Vadeen/Mr.
 Ciancio for recess use
- Games
- Fidget Spinners see below for more on fidgets
- Trading cards
- Toy cell phones
- Make-up can be worn but cannot be applied/shared at school
- Electronic devices i.e. Game Boy/Nintendo, iPod

If students bring any of the above items to school, the items will be confiscated and **may or may not** be retrievable. Items may be kept until the end of day, end of week, or end of year.

Fidgets/Fidget Spinners: As a reminder, fidgets (e.g., slime, sand and spinners) are not allowed at school unless pre-approved and documented on a student's specific learning plan (Individual Education Plan or 504 plan). At Sunset Ridge PK-8, we have a supply of school-approved fidgets that we can and do provide if your child needs help with focus and attention to tasks. We ask parents not to send any fidgets to school. If you feel your child can benefit from a fidget, please consult with your child's teacher or with Mr. Vadeen/Mr. Ciancio.

Gum/Candy - Gum chewing is not allowed unless under the supervision and knowledge of a teacher. Normally, we discourage candy at school. There are times when a teacher may reward a student with candy. One piece of candy at lunch is acceptable.

Hallway Rules

- Walk on the right side of the hallway in an orderly manner.
- Use appropriate indoor voices.
- Keep the hallways clean and free from litter.
- Respect the personal space of others.
- Follow instructions from staff members.

 Public Displays of Affection:Students who are engaging in public displays of affection will be addressed by faculty. Failure to alter behavior or students exhibiting habitual public displays of affection will be subject to disciplinary action as outlined in the student code of conduct.

Cafeteria Rules

- Wait patiently in line and use appropriate table manners.
- Clean up after yourself and dispose of trash properly.
- Respect the cafeteria staff and their instructions.
- Use appropriate language and behavior.
- Follow any additional guidelines established by the school.

Library Rules

- Follow the instructions and guidelines provided by Mrs. Garcia.
- Handle books and library materials with care.
- Return borrowed items on time.

Playground Rules

- Engage in safe and inclusive play.
- Follow the instructions and guidelines set by the adults who are outside.
- Show respect for others and their personal space.
- Use playground equipment properly and responsibly.
- Report any accidents or unsafe situations to the staff members who are outside.
- STAY COMPLETELY AWAY FROM DOGS IN NEIGHBORING YARDS. SHOULD A DOG BE LOOSE ON THE SCHOOL GROUNDS, STAY COMPLETELY AWAY FROM THE DOG.

Playground equipment and balls are provided for student enjoyment at recess. Safety rules and procedures for proper care of equipment will be enforced.

The following activities are prohibited:

- Throwing rocks, gravel, snowballs, etc. at any time;
- Sitting on fences and climbing fences;
- Sliding on ice or snow;
- Pulling on other people's clothes;
- Running on the blacktop;
- Wrestling;
- Giving piggyback rides or lifting other children;
- Swinging other students around;
- Kicking, hitting, tripping or karate kicking
- TAG or any game that mimics tag regardless of what it may be called

Bus Rules

- Arrive at the bus stop on time and in an orderly manner.
- Follow the instructions of the bus driver.
- Remain seated and face forward during the bus ride.
- Use appropriate language and behavior.
- Keep the bus clean and free from damage.

Dress Code

- Students are expected to dress in a neat, clean, and modest manner.
- Clothing should be appropriate for a learning environment and promote safety. Clothing that displays or promotes alcohol, drugs, sexual innuendo, gang affiliation or violence is not allowed.
- Clothing and accessories that display offensive language, symbols, or images are not allowed.
- Dress appropriately for the weather conditions and any planned activities.
- Shirts and tops should cover the entire torso and shoulders. Tank tops, halter tops, and spaghetti straps are not permitted.
- Pants, shorts, skirts, and dresses should be worn at an appropriate length. They should reach mid-thigh or longer.
- No hats or hoods should be worn inside the school building. No headwear
- Footwear should be safe and appropriate for school activities.
- Shoes must be worn at all times, and they should be safe and appropriate for the school environment.
- Short shorts or mini skirts (middle thigh length is appropriate length for shorts/skirts). Rule of Thumb: If the student can touch skin when placing hands to their sides, the shorts are too short and students will be required to change clothes.
- Midriff shirts are not allowed and shirts will not be allowed to be tied in the back (belly must not be shown).
- Large amounts of skin cannot be exposed
- No see-through clothing
- No pajamas, no pajama pants, no slippers, robes, blankets.
- Bras or bra straps cannot be visible
- 2-finger rule for width of straps on shirts (no spaghetti straps)
- Clothing with suggestive pictures or words
- No sagging. All pants must cover undergarments, including shorts, and must rest no lower than the top of the hips.
- Other clothing that distracts from our learning environment
- Hairstyles that disrupt the learning environment of the classroom will be brought to the attention of parents and case by case decisions will be made by administration.
- No unnatural effects added (i.e. no face gems or unnatural face modifications)

Grooming Guidelines

- Maintain good personal hygiene and cleanliness.
- Extreme hairstyles or colors that disrupt the learning environment are not allowed.
- Makeup should be minimal and age-appropriate.
- Jewelry and accessories should be safe and non-distracting.

Dress Code Enforcement

- Any school staff can request a student change their attire if inappropriate, however, the administration will make the final determination if a student's attire is appropriate for school.
- Students found in violation of the dress code will be asked to make appropriate adjustments or change into provided clothing.
- Repeat offenses may result in disciplinary action.

Consequences for Misconduct

In the event of a violation of the school code of conduct, consequences may be imposed based on the severity of the infraction. Consequences may include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Verbal warning
- Loss of privileges
- Parent/guardian notification
- Detention
- In-school suspension
- Out-of-school suspension/expulsion
- Referral to counseling or intervention programs
- Restitution for damages caused
