Principal Comments

Ruth Elison:

- Videographer at Seussical this year was covered by donations
- Funding Request: Piano Keyboard Lab
 - There are three ways to solidify music notes/knowledge:
 - 1-recorders (doing already)
 - 2- band (available in 6th grade)
 - 3- keyboards (sometimes we can borrow these from Jackson)
 - 61-key keyboard on Amazon for \$100; 36 + headphones = \$3800 (headphones will have to be ordered from District Tech Facility)
 - work out storage with Jeff
 - one idea brought up is to store a keyboard in each classroom to use during classroom freetime
 - we may be able to loan them out to other schools
 - would be used in one unit per year for six weeks in each grade
 - PBC moved and voted to fund Piano Lab with \$3800
- can we upload the lip sync videos to the Booster web page?
- we need the Seussical cast photos for the Booster web page (Nicole has access to cast photo page)

Audrea Neville:

- Laminator - close to dying and we need a new one. Can PBC purchase?

-Suggestions:

With the noise in the gym and the distorted mic it was difficult to listen for announcements and names;

Could add a bounce house, charge tickets to bounce or maybe a balloon animal person next time;

LOVED having the 6th grade and older able to volunteer. They really enjoyed being able to do it, it just worked out really well for our family. It's such a great way for older kiddos to get to visit their alma mater and be there with younger siblings.;

If you do the carnival theme again, better instructions for those taking over games halfway through the night. At my Booth we were just guessing as to what we were supposed to do.;

We VERY much appreciated the opportunity to purchase raffle tickets before hand;

Next year if the games will not be open all night, this should be advertised. When we got there at 7pm everything was shut down and popcorn/cotton candy was sold out. Not great considering it wasn't supposed to end for at least another hour.;

I'm concerned about the cost. Once kids used tickets there wasn't anything to do and it got very expensive. Less people spent on auction too.
