CSDA Happenings

Grade 4: Fourth graders will finish up *The Tiger Rising* next week. Students will start their second Geometry Unit and begin making their geometry dictionary.

Grade 5: Fifth graders have started reading argumentative texts, determining a text's claim, and supporting reasons. Next week, students will focus on reading for the pros and cons of zoos.

Grade 6: Sixth graders are excited to be diving deep into the realm of the ancient civilization of Mesopotamia. Currently, they are discussing the five necessary features of a civilization and the geography of the location.

CSDA Unified Arts: In the library, students are working on learning how to evaluate sources for their research projects and developing a good open essential question about that research.

RMMS Happenings

Pre-K: Preschoolers will continue learning about the weather and colors next week. Some of their favorite activities are sure to be color mixing at the science center and making a rain stick. **Grade K:** Kindergarteners will be introduced to inflected endings during Readers' Workshop next week. They will hunt through our books to identify "sight words in disguise" as they find sight words with an "s", "es", "ing", or "ed" in our books.

Grade 1: First graders will explore nonfiction in both reading and writing. They will also celebrate the start of spring through reading, poetry, and art.

Grade 2: Second graders are exploring the world of nonfiction in both reading and writing. They will be starting to look at maps in social studies.

Grade 3: Third graders are continuing to explore traditional literature in reading and fraction lessons in math. They are beginning to learn about forces in motion in science and working to practice spelling patterns in word study.

RMMS Unified Arts: Library classes are exploring different genres of storytelling and discussing lessons that can be found in many of these stories. Kindergarten is listening, reciting, and discussing nursery rhymes. Grade 1 is studying well known fairy tales like Snow White and their alternate versions. Grade 2 will have an introduction to Aesop's Fables and finding the messages contained in the story. Grade 3 is learning about ancient Greece and mythology and how stories can appear in our daily lives.

Daylight Savings Time

If your child has had difficulty waking up or been more irritable this week, it may be related to the time change. Our body's own time-keeping machine regulates sleep and metabolism. So, a time shift disrupts our sleep and circadian rhythms. It takes circadian and sleep rhythms a little "lag time" to transition. The time change can affect sleeping and waking patterns for 5 to 7 days. So think about one week ahead. The upcoming week should be better.



Seasonal Spring Allergies

Keeping Symptoms in Check

Symptoms of seasonal allergies include a stuffy or runny nose, sneezing, itchy eyes and nose, sore throat, cough, and dark circles under the eyes.

- Have your child wash their hands and face as soon as they come in from playing outside so they don't rub pollen in their eyes and nose.
- Check the forecast for pollen levels, and limit outdoor activities when pollen counts are at their highest.
- In combination with taking steps to limit your child's exposure to allergy triggers, there are many safe, effective allergy medicines that target specific symptoms your child is struggling with the most.
- Most allergy medications are now overthe-counter and generally fall into the categories of oral antihistamines, nose sprays and eye drops.
- Check with your doctor on the best option for your child.

Illness Circulating

- Strep Throat If your child has a sore throat this can be diagnosed with a rapid strep test or throat culture. If diagnosed with strep throat, your child must be fever free and on antibiotics for a minimum of 24 hours before returning to school.
 - WHEN TO STAY HOME

To prevent contagious illness, stay home from school with the following:

- Fever (Temp 100.0 or greater)- until feverfree without medication for 24 hours
- Vomiting or Diarrhea until symptom free for 24 hrs
- New/ Uncontrolled Cough or Sore Throatcontact MD
- New or Unexplained Rash- contact MD
- <u>COVID-19</u> Updated Guidance as of 3/1/24::Covid positive persons should stay at home and away from others until at least 24 hours after symptoms are getting better overall and the person is fever free (and not using fever-reducing medication). After this 24 hour period it is recommended to wear a well-fitting mask for 5 days when around others.
- COVID 19 now falls under the CDC Respiratory Virus Guidance


