LEARNING SNAPSHOT

Year 1 have enjoyed their Maths this week. The children have been using the words 'heavier and lighter' to compare the mass of different objects. The children really enjoyed using the balance scales to compare the mass of objects in the classroom. They have also used rulers to measure the length of objects. In English, the children have worked in groups to create and perform a call and response poem called 'Thank You for the Rain.' In Art, the children have been learning about weather symbols and have enjoyed creating their own using materials from the garden.

Ask me: What is Mass?







Year 2 started reading a new text this week, 'The Secret of Black Rock', and have been doing some reading comprehension, story retellings and understanding different character perspectives. In maths, we have continued with our measurement topic with a focus on mass. In design and technology we have been looking at beach hut designs and even sketched and labelled our own design with key words. In science we planted cress seeds and will be observing these over the coming days.







Year 3 learnt how cams work, creating their own prototype using tools safely for cutting and joining materials and components. In Maths, having completed our unit on 'Fractions', we are using skills taught previously in our new unit 'Mass and Capacity', from identifying numbers on scales to comparing different masses. We have thoroughly enjoyed reading 'The Iron Man' this half-term, having written a newspaper article about a contest between our main and sub-characters.

Year 4 enjoyed their painting afternoon on Wednesday. They tried techniques to create atmospheric perspective using pencil and watercolours. They also enjoyed creating warm and cold colours and looking at warm and cold paintings. During the morning activity Year 4 have been working on the key skills needed for their next school; making sure they can tie their ties and do their shoe laces.

Ask me: About atmospheric perspective.



Reception have enjoyed learning about life down on the farm this week. We have read the story Rosie's Walk where Rosie is being followed by a sneaky fox! Rosie wrote the class a letter asking for help to find a new walk where the fox won't find her and she asked them to draw her a map. We have been trying hard with using our sounds to label what you might find on a farm and have enjoyed using technology to do a farm animal scavenger hunt!
