

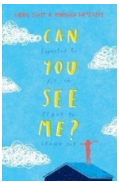

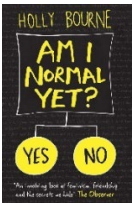
Camouflage (Autism)

First in a four part series coauthored by Libby who has autism and based on her experiences



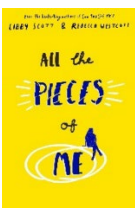
Am I normal Yet? (OCD)

Describing just how difficult life can be for a young autistic girl in a mainstream secondary school.



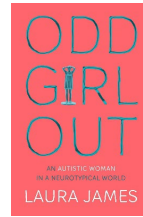
The Rosie Project (Asperger's Syndrome)

Sam who is the only one who understands his autistic brother Avery's needs and who breaks into other peoples houses to have a place to sleep for the night, then he breaks into the wrong house.



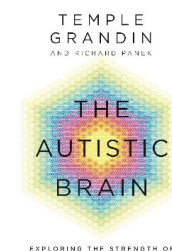
Odd Girl Out (Autism)
