


Thank you for reading the Early Childhood monthly newsletter! This month includes new activities to help children birth to 5 practice school readiness skills.

LANGUAGE AND LITERACY

READING INFORMATIONAL TEXT

Read an informational text to your child about spring or gardening/planting. After reading, model connecting information from the text to life experiences. Ask your child what they like about spring or what they like to do in spring. Take a walk and talk about how the weather changes from winter to spring. Talk about what you notice in the environment in spring. Talk about how the new plants and flowers they see grow.

Give your child the opportunity to plant a flower seed, take care of it, and watch it grow. Have your child draw a picture of the flower each week to show how it is changing.





Reading Foundational Skills: Phonological Awareness


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MATH DESCRIBE AND COMPARE MEASURABLE ATTRIBUTES


Help your child gather two items of different lengths. Line up the two items so they are at the same starting point. Use words such as longer or shorter to compare the length of the two objects.

Throughout your day, find other opportunities to use words that compare measurable attributes such as taller/shorter, heavier/lighter, larger/smaller.

SOCIAL FOUNDATIONS


I can self-regulate by taking three calming breaths.

- Put both of your arms at your sides.
- While taking a deep breath in, bring your arms up over your head.
- Exhale slowly while bringing your arms down to your sides.
- Repeat 3 times.

You can try this one with a friend or family member. Hold hands and take a breath together, bringing both of your hands up over your head!

FINE MOTOR DEVELOPMENT

Using play-doh or clay is a great way to build fine motor development. This activity helps strengthen your child's hand muscles through squeezing, pinching, and pulling movements. Practice creating feelings plates! Give your child a paper plate and a feeling. Have your child recreate this feeling using play-doh.



Need a new playdough recipe? Try this one!

2 tbsp oil food coloring 1 cup flour 1 cup water 1/2 cup salt 2 tsp cream of tartar

Mix together oil, water and food coloring. Stir in the rest of ingredients. Cook on medium or low heat, stirring constantly, until mixture pulls away from sides of saucepan and forms a ball. This will only take a few minutes. Remove from pan, cool slightly and then gently knead. Will keep soft for a few weeks if stored in a plastic bag.
