We have been successful in many areas since the start of the 2023-2024 school year. One area includes strengthening the overall safety and security of the buildings through staff and student behaviors as well as utilizing a security grant to upgrade our facilities and hire a resource officer. As a district we have shifted our focus on utilizing aligned curriculum taught with fidelity in all K-12 classrooms and we continue to support this work through our learning coaches and interventionists. As a district we have made a commitment to offer more early education opportunities for our students by expanding our Great Start Readiness Program (GSRP) programing. With this expansion more students are receiving four-year-old preschool through Clintondale Community Schools. One final area we have been focused on during the first six months has been the support of our students' social emotional wellness. Through the use of our behavior coaches we have continued to push a focus on restorative practices and support each individual student in our classrooms, with our support staff, administrators, as well as the utilization of our behavior coaches. As a district, we realize that our job has just begun to move Clintondale Community Schools forward, and we appreciate all of your support.

Moving forward for the next six months we will continue not only to capitalize and work on the above initiatives but also expand on these to make strides to better support our students. Plans for the 2024-2025 school year will also be our focus during the next six months. We will be focusing on expanding our early childhood education opportunities through additional childcare for students that are not school age as well as school age programming. Our GSRP programming will continue to see expansions for four-year old preschool students, and we will also look to focus on a Young 5's option for our younger students that fall within the kindergarten age. Please also know that plans for the middle school and high school are also taking place as we look to offer more opportunities and options for our students while supporting them academically and socially. As we continue to move forward to support our amazing students please know I am always available. Thank you for all that you do to support Clintondale Community Schools students and staff. CLINTONDALE COMMUNITY SCHOOLS CELEBRATES REMARKABLE GROWTH

Throughout the past school year, our teachers and staff at Clintondale have made incredible strides in performance and impact in our students' lives. This can be seen firsthand with our recent Michigan School Index Report.

The Michigan School Index System measures how well public schools are doing in seven important areas. These areas include student progress, how well students are doing in their studies, the overall quality and success of the school, how many students graduate, the progress of students learning English, how many students take assessments, and how many English learners participate.

Assessment Participation Index Schools get points in each area based on how well they meet their goals. The total points add up to an overall score between 0 and 100. This system helps identify which schools might need extra support.

The overall score is based on the data available for each school. Some schools might not have enough students or data for certain areas. For example, elementary schools don't have a graduation rate. If a school is missing data for some areas, the points from those areas are spread out proportionally to the remaining areas.

Clintondale Community Schools is excited to share that each school's overall index score has gone up. Across the entire district, our scores have increased by 9.45% from 2021- 2022. The Growth Index, which measures improvement, went up by 38.45%. We're proud of the hard work from Clintondale students and staff, and we're looking forward to even more growth in the future!

Introducing the New SRO:
Officer Dittmer, our full-time

With his patrol car stationed at the front for swift response, he actively engages with students at events, fostering a positive and secure environment. His primary goal is to build quality relationships, creating a safe and supportive learning atmosphere.


Community Updates



Gym Upgrades Unveiled

With the generous contribution from The C Club of \$50,000, the redesign and construction of the upper areas of our high school gym are underway. Above the girls' locker room will be our new, 4,500 square foot weight room. Complete with a new 8-station rig, our weight room will also include a large functional movement area. Above the boys' locker room will be a 4,500 square foot turf area that multiple sports will be able to utilize for skill development. A retractable batting cage is being installed so that cheer and wrestling will be able to make use of the area as well as baseball and softball.





Basketball Team on Stellar Start

Our varsity boys basketball team is off to a 5-1 start. Justin Gloster, Jr. had a 39 point effort against Sterling Heights. Under the leadership of first-year coach, Marquis Chavez, and his assistants, Scott Johnson, Ernie Freeman, and Jahmi Russell, our overall boys basketball program is a combined 18-6 to start the season. The team GPA of our varsity boys basketball team is currently 3.3. Additionally, Antonio Guzman has been named our new varsity baseball coach. Community Updates

College Exploration

Clintondale students have had the opportunity to visit a variety of schools this year including Oakland University, Wayne State University, Central Michigan University, and Siena Heights University. Mr. Zimmerman is still attempting to plan field trips at a few more schools before the end of this year. In October, Clintondale had over 20 college admission reps visit the school and talk with students about what each of their respective schools has to offer.









Xello

Clintondale High School students began Xello in February. Xello is a career exploration tool provided by the Macomb Intermediate School District. Xello is a requirement by the state of Michigan and helps students think and plan through their next adventure after high school. Xello data is also used and analyzed by the school to help plan for student schedules and shape our career and technical education classes around.



Career Quest

Clintondale High School students had opportunity to visit CareerQuest SE in November 2023. This huge career exploration event had students tour and speak with a different magnitude of employers. This event was separated into four career clusters. These clusters were health and human services. technology or IT, trades, and construction.



FAFSA Information

The FAFSA is the free application for federal student aid and is the number one indicator of a student attending a college or trade school. The state of Michigan pushes for at least a state percentage of 60% FAFSA completion in the senior class at each respective school. There is a student part of FAFSA and a parent part that needs to be completed for the FAFSA to be finalized and sent to schools. By filing the FAFSA students are able to possibly earn grants and loans such as the federal Pell Grant. The federal Pell Grant maxes out at around \$7,000 per year. If a student is federal Pell Grant eligible, they are typically eligible for 100% tuition coverage at any in-state school throughout the state of Michigan.



This school year was the first time in over 30 years the FAFSA has been modified. The FAFSA typically opens October 1st and this year did not open until January 1st. This is the latest the FAFSA has been delayed. Students will not receive financial aid reports that are the cost breakdown for each school they have been accepted to until March at the earliest. It is imperative students and families attempt to finalize the FAFSA as soon as possible to receive these cost breakdowns by the end of March to make an informed decision on school.

GREAT START READINESS PROGRAM: EXPANDING OPPORTUNITIES FOR FREE EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION

Clintondale Community Schools has long been committed to providing quality education to its youngest learners through the Great Start Readiness Program (GSRP). This initiative has been a cornerstone of early childhood education in the district, helping prepare four-year-olds for success in kindergarten and beyond. The recent expansion of the program in the Fall of 2023 marks a significant milestone in Clintondale's dedication to fostering early learning.

The Great Start Readiness Program was established by the Michigan Department of Education (MDE) as part of the state's broader initiative to enhance early childhood education and ensure that all children enter kindergarten ready to learn. The program addresses disparities in school readiness among young children, particularly those from economically disadvantaged backgrounds.

In the Fall of 2023, the Great Start Readiness Program in Clintondale Community Schools underwent a significant expansion. The program, originally operating four days per week, transitioned to a full five-day schedule. This expansion not only increases the amount of time children spend in the program, but also enhances the overall learning experience by providing more opportunities for socialization, cognitive development, and school readiness skills.

Recognizing the increasing demand for high-quality early childhood education, Clintondale Community Schools took a proactive step by opening additional GSRP classrooms at strategic locations. Two new classrooms were introduced. One at the Clintondale Childcare Center, and a second room was added at McGlinnen Elementary. These additions ensure that more families in the community have convenient access to free preschool.

With the expansion of the program, Clintondale Community Schools is excited to announce open seats at McGlinnen Elementary for eligible four-year-olds. Making Districtwide Improvements Possible with a Sinking Fund

If approved, the Sinking Fund would allow Clintondale Community Schools to create a fund to be used strictly for renovations to facilities, sites, parking lots and school buildings.



2024-2025 Priority projects: Enhanced building security and fencing for all schools

What is a sinking fund?

A sinking fund allows a school district to make district improvements for specific purposes defined by the state.

How is it funded?

A sinking fund is created by a local tax millage levied on all property located in the district. The district proposal is for a levy on 3 mills which would result in \$1,161,000 per year for 10 years for district improvements.

What we CAN spend a sinking fund on

- Enhanced building security
- Chain link fencing
- Parking lot, sidewalks and asphalt replacement
- School elevators
- New vehicles (trucks, vans)
- New track and athletic fields
- New windows and carpet
- Bleachers, concession stands and locker rooms
- New marquees for all schools
- Water main replacement
- Heating program (Honeywell heating controllers)
- Air handling units
- Landscaping

Benefits of the sinking fund

- Additional funding for building security improvements will create enhanced secure entrances.
- Improved learning environments make Clintondale more attractive and potentially boost property values.
- Transparency and accountability show taxpayers exactly where and how the money will be spent.
- More money remains in the general fund where it can be spent on education.

What we CANNOT spend a sinking fund on

- Salaries and benefits
- Equipment and supplies (refrigerators, sound and lighting systems)
- Maintenance (painting of buildings)
- Furnishing (curtains, cabinets, desks and chairs)
