

District Adds New Communication Tools

Earlier this year, installation of a digital billboard along Park Avenue in front of the Middle and High School building was completed. This remote-controlled display projects a slideshow, rotating every 3 to 5 seconds, with the most pressing news and information for MG families, staff and community.

Additionally, a mobile app was initiated in an effort to better communicate with staff, families and the community.

The app mirrors the information found on the revitalized website and includes details for each district building, including announcements, events, athletic schedules and cafeteria menus.

The free app is available in both Apple and Google Play stores by searching for Mount Gilead EV Schools or by scanning the appropriate QR code at the right.



Cherry Street Renovations; Fieldhouse Build Continue

Phase 1 of renovations to the Cherry Street building that began last Fall is nearly completed.

The building, dedicated in 1952, had only had minor updates and repairs since it was first constructed. Recently a new floor; new windows, door and lights; new bleachers; an updated sound system; a fresh coat of paint and a fixed roof with 10-year warranty are a few of the most noticeable changes.

Stadium improvements, including the addition of a 7,000 square-foot fieldhouse building, are also underway.

After a short hiatus due to winter weather, the construction crew is back on site. Roof trusses, walls and windows have been added in recent weeks and crews continue to connect electric and water services.

Upon completion, our community that attends athletic functions at the stadium will find new restrooms with adequate facilities, a larger concession stand space that will allow our Athletic Boosters to provide an expanded menu, much needed storage space for field and athletic equipment, covered entryway for patrons to get out of the weather when needed, and two flexible locker room spaces that will provide additional indoor space for athletic teams in the winter season too.

From the Desk of Superintendent

Over the past few years while serving as the Superintendent of Mount Gilead Exempted Village Schools, I've had individuals ask me questions about the income tax that helps provide local funds to the school district.

The first thing to note is that the school district has a continuing 0.75% income tax that was approved by the voters years ago. More recently in 2019, voters approved an additional five-year limited 0.75% income tax. The current five-year income tax is due to expire at the end of 2024. The total income tax assessed currently is 1.5%.

Our district has a strategic plan that was developed with multiple stakeholder input and our ability to implement the strategic plan is contingent in part on school funding. I'm very proud that as a district, we're making steady progress. Our most recent State Report Card earned our district a 4 out of 5 stars. Our Middle School is rated a 5-Star school and our High School is a 4.5 Star school.

Our strategic plan calls for us to "Equip", "Empower", and "Inspire" our students. At the High School we're working hard with our students on graduation pathways so that every student is prepared for what lies ahead whether that is learning a skilled trade in partnership with Tri-Rivers Career Center, enrollment into the Military, pursuit of higher education or even direct employment following graduation. We have long standing programs like Jobs for Ohio Graduates (JOG) and Career Based Intervention (CBI) to support our High School students or new programs like Positive Behavior Intervention Support (PBIS), College Credit Plus (CCP) Academy, or Robotics/Drones/ Engineering and Vocational Agriculture now starting at the Middle School. Park Avenue Elementary is beginning to infuse Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Math (STEAM) into their curriculum. This Spring, our Park Avenue students will produce a musical - "Finding Nemo Kids"!

We've improved our athletic facilities considerably. Our track and football field were the worst surfaces our kids would compete on throughout the season leading into 2021. Today, our kids compete on the best track and football field in the region and the stadium is a wonderful place to hold athletic competitions. With a new stadium building set to be completed by the Fall Season, our fans will have wonderful restrooms and concession facilities where previous facilities were inadequate.

Cherry Street gym has been refurbished and the next generation can add to the rich history that exists in that space. Our track and Cherry St. gym are open during the day throughout the week for our community to use for exercise. While great strides have been made, we would like to continue renovating Cherry Street to protect our investment and enable students to attend school there once again as growth necessitates it.


The following questions have been raised specific to the income tax often:

CAN THE DISTRICT HAVE INCOME TAX LEVIES WITH BOTH THE TRADITIONAL AND EARNED-INCOME TAX BASE?

No. ORC 5748.02 (E) prohibits a district from having school district income tax levies with both bases.

The MGEVS currently has a continuing .75% Income Tax approved that is "Traditional". The renewal levy that is on the ballot is for an





additional 5 year time period and must also be "Traditional". While the district is not opposed to making the renewal income tax levy one that is "earned-income", Ohio Revised Code does not allow for two separate income types and the district cannot afford losing at the ballot to convert the .75% continuing "traditional" income tax to an "earned income tax" as the continuing income tax generates roughly 50% of our local share of school funding.

CAN THE INCOME TAX ON THE BALLOT TO RENEW THE TIME-BOUND 5 YEAR LIMITED INCOME TAX BE CONSIDERED A RENEWAL?

Yes. ORC 5748.02(B)(1) states that If the tax rate being proposed is no higher than the total tax rate imposed by the expiring tax or taxes, the resolution may state that the proposed tax is not an additional income tax.

IF THE RENEWAL INCOME TAX IS PASSED, WHEN WILL THE DISTRICT BEGIN COLLECTING?

January 1, 2025

Curriculum and Development Updates Director Emily Ross (eross@mgschools.org)

In my role as Director of Curriculum and Development, I facilitate the Ohio Improvement Process, focusing on enhancing student success. We have three main district-wide improvement goals from 2021-2024:

- 1. Improve Student Achievement,
- 2. Develop Educator Capacity, and
- 3. Ensure Students are Ready to Learn.

Each school tailors its specific goals under these areas. We regularly monitor progress, updating goals every three years to guide funding plans.

Recently, we completed the One Needs Assessment, using state-collected data like graduation rates and test scores. Staff and administrators provided input through surveys. Luckily, our data aligned well with our goals, so we're refining rather than starting anew.

The next step is creating a One Plan, including SMART goals, action steps, and evidence-based practices. This plan ties into our funding application for Federal Title and IDEA Special Education Funds, with each goal having an associated funding measure. We aim to share our One Plan with the community by April, seeking input before board approval through a draft on the website and a request for feedback from stakeholders.

VR headset classroom kits are also being used by Middle and High School students.






TRIO Program Explains Importance of GPA to Freshmen Students

- A copy of up to date immunization records
- Proof of residence (utility bill or purchase/rental agreement)

School Navigator Provided by PASS

Why have a school navigator? Research finds that providing increased support to students is linked with better academic performance (Johnston et al; 2020) and evidence shows student's sense of belonging is protective for mental health (Gopalan 2023).

I'm Jeff Beale, a retired teacher from Ohio's largest urban school district. Since December 2023, I've been facilitating as Mount Gilead Schools school navigator through collaboration as an educator staff for Prevention Awareness Support Services (PASS) Delaware-Morrow County.

The school navigator program is fully funded and fiscally responsible for by the Delaware-Morrow Mental Health and Recovery Services Board. The school navigator is considered part of the Ohio Department of Education and Workforce's Tier I prevention strategies. Also known as universal prevention, which can be offered to all students and focuses on developing knowledge and skills to engage in healthy behaviors and decision-making. This increases awareness of the dangers and consequences of risky behaviors like substance use, suicide, bullying, and other harmful behaviors.

The school navigator can act as a link between the schools and community resources. The navigator works hand in hand with the school counselors, school social workers, teachers, school resource officers, and other school staff to provide referrals to community resources for students and families.

Finally, I'd like to conclude you with the special words from Mount Gilead mission: To inspire individuality, equip all students for success, create school spirit, and enrich community pride.



MGEVS Searching for Preschool-Aged Children with Disabilities

What is Child Find?

Child Find is the process of locating, identifying and evaluating children with disabilities that may be in need of special education or related services.



What is the purpose of Child Find?

• To alert parents, professionals and the public to students who may have special needs.

• To guarantee that school districts find children who may have disabilities and who otherwise may not have come to their attention.

- To enable eligible children to receive the special education and related services that are needed.
- To promote public awareness of disabilities.

What is a disability?

A physical or mental condition for children ages birth to 3 that may result in a developmental delay requiring special education and related services. For children ages 3 through 5 — A child who is experiencing a delay in one or more of the following areas: physical development; cognitive development; communication development; social or emotional development; or adaptive development; or, a child who is identified with any of the conditions listed in the paragraph below.

For children ages 5 through 21 — Identification of one or more of the following conditions: autism, deaf blindness, hearing impairment including deafness, cognitive disability, multiple disabilities, orthopedic impairment, other health impairment, emotional disturbance, specific learning disability, speech or language impairment, traumatic brain injury and/or visual impairment.


How can you help?

If you are aware of a child who may have special needs, please notify his/her school district, Parents, relatives, public and private agency employees, childcare providers, physicians and concerned citizens are encouraged to help school districts find any child, ages birth - 21, who may have a disability and are in need of special education and related services.

What happens next?

The school district will contact the parents of the child to discuss the next steps in the evaluation and identification process. This process is provided at no cost to the family. If a need is identified, the child can begin receiving the appropriate special education and related services during the school day. **Who can you contact?**



The Mt. Gilead football team performed more than 1,500 community service hours collectively over the course of 2023.






