

## RUNNING START BASICS

- Dual credit program for HS juniors and seniors
- Available fall, winter, and spring terms. Summer is sometimes available
- Tuition paid through Running Start
  - Students responsible for fees and books
    - Students qualifying for fee waiver get most fees and books paid
- May take up to 21 college level credits per term
- 15 credits = typical full time class load
- 1 high school credit = 5 college credits
- 100-level courses and above

### RUNNING START BASICS

- Can be full time or part time college student
- Can take transfer or career technical education courses
- This is your experience

## HOW DOES A STUDENT QUALIFY?

- Junior or Senior in high school
- Guided Self Placement
  - All students are required to take English Guided Self-Placement.
  - Guided Self-Placement (GSP) for English and math are processes designed to provide you with information needed to make an informed decision about your English and math placement.
  - Math typically completed at high school for HS grad requirements. Algebra 2.
  - To take college-level math for associate degree, students must to take Math Guided Self-Placement



### Every term students pay:

PROGRAM COSTS

- Student fees
  - EX: 15 credits (full-time student) \$225.00 (approx) per term at Pierce College
- Course fees
- Books
  - \$300+ for full-time students
- Supplies
- Provide own transportation



**Student Fee Waiver:** available to eligible students (waives student fees and excess credit tuition; automatically eligible for book loan program)

## BEING A COLLEGE STUDENT MEANS...

- Classes may move at a faster pace
- Grades appear on permanent college and high school transcript
- Attendance/Engagement is required to be successful
- Different holiday schedule
- Communication between college, guidance counselors, and family must comply with FERPA
- Active partnership between student, family, guidance counselor, and college is essential to student success!



## BEING A COLLEGE STUDENT MEANS...

### Be Pro-Active!

- You have to initiate communication, both sending and receiving.
- You must regularly check on messages in your preferred email, ctcLink, and Starfish.

## Be Fully Engaged!


- You must attend class, both in person and on-line.







## Fall/Summer Term Registration Opens:

Returning Students May 6, 2024 New students May 20, 2024

#### **Summer Term Classes Begins:**

July 1, 2024

#### **Fall Term Classes Begins:**

September 23, 2024

#### Complete Admissions (Now):

- Complete online admissions application for fall 2024
- Complete Guided Entry Processes (watch for your acceptance email):
  - Complete New Student Guide
  - Complete Guided Self-Placement (GSP) for English (required) and Math placement (optional if taking math at High School and not completing associate degree)
  - Complete Intake and Engagement Form
  - Meet with your HS counselor and verify your graduation requirements
    - Counselors will share timeline
    - Review high school completion requirements
    - Complete and sign Enrollment Verification Form (EVF)

#### Get Connected and Registered (April – September)

- Schedule an appointment with a student success coach (college advisor)
  - Bring graduation requirements to your appointment
- Register for your classes and get your books/materials
- Submit your EVF to the college. It is your payment.

## Do you have to take classes at the High School?

- Advanced Algebra is the only class you must take at the High School.
- 2. Students **can** take classes at the high school if they **choose** to do so.
- 3. Student's do not have to take at the high school if they have completed Advanced Algebra.

## Graduation Pathway

#### Options:

- Pass the SBA Math (May 2024) & English (April 2024)
  Pass a College level Math 100 and above
  Pass a College level English 100 and above
  Students can also take 2 credits of a CTE pathway
