

## HMS SCHOOL BASED HEALTH

Did you know we have a health clinic directly in our school? Hamden Public Schools is fortunate to partner with Cornell Scott Hill Health Center to support students and families.

Services are for ALL students at Hamden Middle School, as well as incoming students! In order to be eligible for care, students must be registered with the clinic. All services are FREE. Clinic sees patients with or without insurance. Please note, this medical care does not replaced your child's pediatrician. The health center is conveniently available during school hours/ school days. It is located on our second floor. House 1.

The SBHC provides the following services:

• Telehealth (Video and/or telephone chat) visits available daily • Physical exams required for school compliance • Sports physicals • Vaccines-all vaccines needed to attend school will be available, including FLU vaccines in the Fall • Sick visits • Treatment for asthma, allergies, obesity, and other health concerns • Referral to specialty care • Mental Health individualized and group counseling • Crisis intervention



#### **CHIPOTLE FUNDRAISER!**



#### **SBAC: OUR STATE ASSESSMENT**

This spring, your child will participate in the annual state assessments in English Language Arts and Mathematics by taking the Smarter

Balanced Assessments, or the Connecticut Alternate Assessment (CTAA) for eligible students. Students in grades 5, 8, and 11 will also be tested in science by taking the Next Generation Standards Science Assessment (NGSS) or the Connecticut Alternate Science Assessment (CTAS).

Student reports will be sent home to parents and guardians in September. You can use the results to see what your child knows and what skills they can demonstrate based on the state grade-level standards taught in the classroom and measured on the state assessments.

All of these standardized assessments are administered online over multiple sessions. These assessments are designed to measure skills in reading comprehension, writing, mathematics, and real-world science using questions that require students to demonstrate a true understanding of content. Additional supports are available for students with special needs and/or Multilingual Learners in all of these statewide assessments. as determined by an individualized education program (IEP), 504 Plan, or the Language Development Plan (LDP).

At HMS, assessments will be administered by the teachers in the spring between April 29th-May 17th. Our SBAC schedule is posted on the HMS Calendar.

- Begin the day with a healthy breakfast.
- Limit distractions so students can concentrate on the day ahead.

We expect that all our students will attain a firm grounding in mathematics, language arts, and science by the time they graduate from high school, preparing them to succeed in the future. Our teachers and administrators are committed to working together to support students with excellent instruction and resources to meet these expectations.
