Dr. Morrissey reviewed the Charter Fund Flexible dollars spending for the 2021-22 school year:
\$250.00 per teacher for classroom materials and supplies
Additional water bottle filling stations including one in the gym

Outdoor bleachers at the basketball courts
Addition of Pickleball courts

This year schools were allocated \$46,000 in Charter Fund Flexible dollars. CMS was required to spend 30,000 in a Campus Security Associate. That person is in the hiring pipeline. A Campus Security Associate is not an officer, but can assist with supervision, monitoring of the building and reviewing camera footage. Schools will also determine how to use an additional \$15,000 for safety and security by the end of the 1st semester.

Dr. Morrissey reviewed the Semester Action Plan Goals for CMS:

Increase the percentage of students eligible to participate in Positive Behavior Intervention System (PBIS) reward activities to 85%

Increase percentage for students meeting their typical growth goal in math to 55% from 53% by the end of the year.

Intervention goal - decrease the number of special education students scoring at Level 1 on the Georgia Milestones End of Grade Assessment in math using the Numeracy Project as a strategy.

Greg Botelho reviewed the history and purpose of the Community Tours. A date will be determined at the next meeting for a November Community Tour.
