### Challenges

- State Budget
  - ✓ 2018/2019 state budget not yet passed.
  - ✓ Result Unknowns for 2018/2019:
    - > Education Subsidy
    - >Transportation Subsidy
    - > Special Education Subsidy
    - >Any further property tax reforms
- Increases in Special Education
  - ✓ Unfunded mandates (\$35MM budget vs \$5.8MM funding)
- Professional contract
  - ✓ Increases 5.1% all-in (assuming no changes year/year)
