Principal's Report

<u>Staffing:</u> Our first grade teacher J. K. Parker has resigned and J. Frazier has been placed in the classroom. We have 2 custodians that we are hiring as well.

<u>No Nonsense Nurturing:</u> This program is going well and teachers are continuing to be trained. We are seeing a positive impact on 90% of our students. Ms. Tolefree shared a success story about a student, and how N.N.N. has helped the student/teacher/class experience a positive change.

<u>Learning Walk:</u> We had a total of about six or seven district leaders and representatives here from the Central Learning Community to evaluate (using a rubric) and provide feedback on teaching in various classrooms. We have been using and referencing the rubric for about 2 years. We shared the largely positive, feedback with our school and celebrated yesterday at a faculty meeting.

CCRPI: The council watched a video that provided an explanation and overview of CCRPI. Our school has a mobility rate that impacts our performance. As of last Friday, we had 41 students enroll after the 10th day of school and 39 students transfer. Our CCRPI score last year was 72.9 and this year is 78.8. The principal shared sub-group data as well as a comparison between Dunwoody Springs and FCS. The presentation included sharing overall growth in Content Mastery (69.2) (up from 68.2). Student progress was 90.8, up in comparison with the State and the District. In the area, closing the gaps, we scored 66.7, which is up for us, but still lower than the district (80.3) and the state (73.8). It is the area of Mathematics where we are focusing our efforts to improve, an area of CCRPI that shows up as a challenge for all of our sub-groups. Readiness was an area, especially around attendance that continues to be an issue, with a score of 81.2. Our climate score was 95.4 (1 point away from a 5 star rating), a score that includes a survey, discipline trends, safety and substance free environment, attendance, and other considerations.
