The report displayed students averaging 16 hours and 18 minutes, and did not account for students who engaged in learning platforms for students with English as a second language.

Salih Murtic, a local brick layer and brick engraver was asked to visit Dunwoody Springs to help plan for a brick patio in the front of the school. The patio will serve as a place to display engraved bricks that will be sold as a school fundraiser.

#### **Principal's Report**

The principal thanked everyone on the council for their commitment and dedication to supporting the students and teachers of Dunwoody Springs.
