SAT Preparation - All juniors will take the SAT on **Wednesday, March 27th**. Schoolhouse is offering a FREE virtual four week prep course. Students can sign up [here](#). Students may also prep using the Bluebook app that is available on their Chromebook. We also encourage all juniors to attend our [free after school SAT prep classes at NHS](#). Please note that March 27th will be an early dismissal for students.

Attendance - Attendance is an essential component of the educational environment. **It is also used to determine eligibility for events such as prom, field trips, and other extracurricular activities.** In order to be eligible for an event such as prom, students must arrive on time and attend all classes on that day. Students who are suspended from school on the day of the event will not be permitted to attend. Administration also reserves the right to deny entry to any student who has accumulated excessive unexcused absences to be considered truant by the date of the event.
