Students are asked questions regarding their feelings of safety, well-being, emotions, coping skills, and access to resources. This is not an anonymous survey. Because it is not anonymous, we are able to assess immediate needs for students and respond. For students with non-emergent support needs, this survey allows us to know what resources to provide. <b>Panorama School Culture and Climate Perception Survey</b>	Yearly Fall: mid September 9/11/23 to 9/22/23  Spring: 3/25/24 to 4/5/24	15 min	Students Grades K-12	<a href="#">Opt out form</a>  <a href="#">Formulario de exclusión</a>	<p><b>Panorama School Culture and Climate Perception Survey</b> is a research backed process for students, families, teachers and staff to better understand and build positive school climate in the schools and the district. The surveys assess: <b>School Culture and Climate</b>- Social and learning climate of the school environment, including rules and norms, behaviors, student engagement, and physical facilities. <b>Positive Relationships</b>- Social connections and interpersonal relationships between students and teachers, like a sense of belonging and valuing of school. <b>School Safety</b>- Physical psychological climate and safety at school including bullying, violence and availability of support for students.</p> <p>District 51 uses this data to assess our work on students' sense of belonging, one of the threads throughout the Strategic Plan and the platform identified to measure success. Individual schools use the data to plan for and improve the climate in their buildings.</p> <p>The survey is completely anonymous and allows all students to have a voice and a personal assessment of the safety and relationships in the school. <b>Healthy Kids</b>	<b>Every other year September 2023 9/18/23-9/29/23</b>	45 min	<b>Students</b> Grades 6th-12th State selects randomly the schools to participate.	<a href="#">Opt Out Form (ENGLISH)</a>  <a href="#">Opt Out Form (SPANISH)</a>	Healthy Kids Colorado Survey (HKCS): This confidential student survey collects anonymous information from students in 6th-12th grades about health-related attitudes and behaviors which includes unintentional injuries and violence; mental health; school safety and physical fighting; tobacco and other substance use; physical activity and nutrition; sexual behaviors; basic demographic info such as age; and risk and protective factors. The survey is administered every two years to randomly selected schools. Fall of 2023 will be the next administration of the HKCS.  The data from this survey benefits both the school district and the community.
