A Message from McKinley Elementary's Principal, Mr. Kemats

As we begin the last three months of the school year, we are continuing to plan events and are looking forward to all that the final months of the school year bring with it. We are looking forward to our Music and Art Programs, Field Trips, the Spring Fling and much more.

Our 3rd and 4th graders performed for the school and their parents for their Art and Music programs in January and February. We will conclude the year with a 1st grade program on March 19th, and Kindergarten on April 9th. Also, mark your calendars for our PTO Spring Fling carnival to be held at McKinley on the evening of Friday, April 12th from 5:00 - 8:00. This is always a great event!

March is the time to start thinking about next school year as we kick off Kindergarten and PreSchool registration for the 2024-25 school year. Call McKinley Elementary at 330-424-9869 to schedule an appointment for your preschool or kindergarten student. Preschoolers should be 4 by September 30th (3 yr olds are also considered, with 4 year olds getting preference), and kindergarteners should be 5 by this date. We can't wait to meet our new groups of students.

Our PTO Valentine's Day Room parties were held in February with students making boxes and trading Valentines, a tradition we were glad could be carried on. The PTO provided treats, water and a book to each student. The McKinley PTO continues to hold monthly meetings the second Thursday of each month at 3:30 at McKinley. Updates are always provided on the McKinley Facebook page. The PTO is always looking for ideas and input on fundraisers and student events.

March will be busy with the 3rd grade Wax Museum on March 8th, Right to Read Week the week of March 11th, Spring Pictures on the 12th, and the 1st grade Art & Music Program on the 19th, also the first day of Spring.

Spring Break will be from Monday, March 25th through Monday, April 1st this year. Classes will resume on Tuesday, April 2nd which will be the beginning of the 4th 9 weeks. We will be scheduling assemblies, field trips and trips to the local park for each grade level as we approach the end of the school year, as well as a Field Day.

Our 5th graders participated in the D.A.R.E. program once again with the Lisbon Police Department. We were also able to hold D.A.R.E. graduation ceremonies in February. The 5th graders will also be presented with an end of year recognition ceremony in May and a two day trip to Camp Frederick.

Our 3rd, 4th and 5th grade students will be taking State of Ohio, English, Math and Science assessments as required by law. Our students will take the English tests the week of April 15th, the Math tests the week of April 22nd, and 5th grade Science the week of April 29th. Also, our 5th graders took the Iowa and CoGat tests for Gifted Identification in January, and our 2nd graders will take it in March. Please try to make sure your students are in school and on time during these testing days, get a good night's rest, and we'll make sure they have breakfast when they arrive.

We continue to recognize Positive Student Behavior each month, as well as All A's and Honor Roll. These students were treated to Ice Cream Sandwiches in January, and we'll recognize them at the conclusion of the third nine weeks in April. The third nine weeks ends March 22nd, the fourth nine weeks



begins April 2nd, and Report Cards will be coming home on April 5th. We are looking forward to a great Spring, a great three months of school, and a great end to another great school year!

McKinley's After School Program

The After School Program has been running strong since October. This is the 5th and final year of the Learning Is Cool After School Program Federal Grant which was written for McKinley Elementary by the Columbiana County Educational Service Center. A few highlights from the past few months. The students participated in a Flat Stanley Project in which they mailed a Flat Stanley to friends or relatives who live out of the area. They then took Stanley on adventures and mailed





back letters, pictures, and souvenirs from
Stanley's Adventures. The After School School
Program hosted a 4 - part Money 101 Workshop
for families which was led by OSU
Extension. The students participate in a wide
variety of activities nightly from homework help,
skills practice, sign language, music recorder
lessons, Spanish, creativity, yoga, martial
arts, snack making and more. They recently had

field trips to The Salem Skate Zone and Camelot Lanes. Additional field trips this year include: Movies 8, Beaver Creek Nature Center, Baker's Golden Dairy, and Raptor Hallow. They have also been in partnership with the McKinley Science Club Pennies for Pets Project.

The McKinley third graders' class books of "How to" articles, published in two volumes by Studentreasures Publishing in Topeka, Kansas, were recently selected as semifinalists in the National Book Challenge. The students wrote 2-4 page, step-by-step instructions on how to do daily tasks like making ramen noodles, putting up a Christmas tree, throwing a Frisbee, and playing

began the writing process in November and mailed their pages to the publisher in December. The third grade teachers held a Publishing Party for the students and families on January 30.
