
Appointments

SAT & ACT Information



Opportunities to Prepare

- The MIHS PTSA offers mock SAT and ACT tests. This is a great option for students to try out and practice these assessments in an environment where the scores don't matter for college entry. Visit the <u>PTSA</u> <u>website</u> for more information on how to register.

Should you take the ACT or SAT?

Many colleges and universities are now "<u>test optional"</u> although some are requiring test scores. You should consult your specific college/university's website for more information to determine if the school is test optional. Another helpful resource is the <u>Fair Test</u> <u>website</u>. Whether you should take the ACT or SAT is dependent on your schools' admission requirements. Please also note that some scholarship opportunities may require a test score.



If you need/plan to take a standardized test, it is recommended that students have these tests taken by the end of their junior year. Students with IEPs or 504s should reach out to <u>Mike Neff</u> to initiate the process for accommodations and must be approved by College Board.



WANIC: Career and Technical Education

Registration for WANIC programs is currently open for current sophomores and juniors. Spaces are limited and registration closes April 15, 2024.

<u>WANIC (Washington Network for</u> <u>Innovative Careers)</u> offers career and technical education for high school juniors and seniors. WANIC is an excellent option for MIHS students who are looking for specific career coursework and training. How To Earn College Credit During High School



DO YOU QUALIFY?

MIHS has several courses that provide students the opportunity to earn both high school and college credits. These college credits originate from many of our local community colleges, including Bellevue College and Lake Washington Technical Institute. For students who are looking to earn academic credibility, this program is ideal, efficient and quite a bargain! Most importantly, students can earn college credit without ever leaving the MIHS campus. It's also important to know that whether the credit originates from a 2- or 4-year college, academic credibility earned is equally invaluable.

STEP 1: Complete one or more of the following MIHS classes during the 2023-2024 school year:

- Accounting
- Biotechnology
- Business Communication & Technology
- Engineering Tech 1 & 2 (must complete both sections)
- Graphic Design (Beginning)
- Photography (Beginning)
- Health/Image
- Horticulture Marketing (Beginning)
- Marketing (Advanced)
- Material Science
- Robotics (Beginning)

STEP 2: Earn a B or better in the course (for yearlong courses, a B or better must be earned in both semesters)

STEP 3: Complete the PNW College Credit registration at

https://www.pnwcollegecredit.org/ by June 1, 2024 (this deadline applies to courses completed either 1st or 2nd semester)

STEP 4: Pay the \$50.00 registration fee at https://www.pnwcollegecredit.org/ by June 17, 2024 (NOTE: This fee covers ALL PNW College Credit courses taken in the 2022-2023 school year.)
