Wanted: Involved parents

What does parent involvement look like in middle school? While you probably won't be volunteering in your child's classroom, they still want your support (even if they don't act like they do). Consider these tips for being a partner in their education.

At school. Make it a priority to attend school events like curriculum nights and school plays. Also, look for ways to help that are related to your tween's activities. If they play in the band, you could volunteer to set up for a concert. If they belong to a book club, you might offer to shelve library boos and talk to them afterward about books you noticed. Or if they are an athlete, maybe you'll work at the concession stand during sporting events.

At home. Offer to quiz your middle grader on material they are studying or to look over a paper their working on. To stay in the loop about what's happening in school, read the website regularly and sign up for email or text alerts. Mention the announcement to your child so they know you're interested in their school.

Zero-Low Grade Make-up

In the 5th week of each 6 weeks, students will have an opportunity to make up a zero or low grade from the daily grade category with a "zero – low grade make-up assignment".

Retesting

Except for 6 weeks and semester tests, students may retake any major test they failed. The student must arrange a time with the teacher.

The maximum grade for a test retaken is a 70.

Homework Online

The homework online is a parent's tool to know the homework assignments for their child. All teachers post homework daily.

Follow these steps: Log onto hebisd.edu Click on 7-12 (located at top right)

Check the teacher's websites.

There are several ways to display assignments and they don't all use the same method.

10 Important Minutes

The very best academically productive time parents can spend is ten minutes per night checking the completion of homework. This procedure should start with checking "Homework Online" to find homework assignments. When the assignment is completed, parents should check the work for completeness before the students place the homework in their binder.

Warning: >Do not accept the excuse, "I left it in my locker."
Incomplete work or zeros will be the result.
>Do not accept, "The teacher took it up."
We never take up homework early.
>Do not accept, "I left my books at school."
There is a set of textbooks on reserve at the Euless Public Library.

If students complete and turn in all homework, success is the result. Zeros and/or incomplete work lead to failing grades and behavior difficulties.

When Should My Child Stay Home?



Stay home:

- Fever is 100° or above
- Vomiting or Diarrhea
- Physician orders to remain home due to injury or illness


May Return When:

- Fever is below 100⁰ without the use of fever reducing medication for 24 hours
- No vomiting or diarrhea for 24 hours
- According to physician instructions and above criteria are met



REQUIREMENTS FOR MEDICATION AT SCHOOL

- Physician order is required-even for over the counter medication such as acetaminophen or ibuprofen
- 2. Parent signature is required.
- 3. ALL medication must be left in the Health Clinic.
- With physician orders and parent permission, inhalers and epinephrine injectors may be carried by student. <u>ALL</u> other medication must remain in the clinic.
- 5. Obtain Physician Request for Medication



HEALTH SCREENING

There are several state mandated health screenings that occur for Junior High students. The following screenings will be conducted during the 1st semester, beginning within the next 2 weeks.

7th grade boys: Vision, hearing, height, weight, blood pressure and Acanthosis Nigricans

7th grade girls: Vision, hearing, height, weight, blood pressure, Acanthosis Nigricans and spinal.

8th grade boys: Spinal, height, weight, blood pressure

Students new to district: vision, hearing, height, weight, blood pressure and additional screening required for age.

BE THERE!

Being in school all day, every day, helps your child get the most out of school. Encourage good attendance with these ideas:

- Point out that there is no substitute for being in class. Your youngster needs to be present to hear teachers explain concepts, to participate in group projects and class discussions, and to ask questions.
- Schedule doctor, dentist, and orthodontist appointments for before or after school hours whenever possible. If you can't, try to arrange them for lunchtime.
- It will be easier for your child to get up on time for school if he has had at least nine hours of sleep. Set a reasonable bedtime, and make sure he puts away electronic devices so he isn't tempted to stay awake to read messages or play games.

Students who maintain good attendance may receive semester **test grade** exemptions at the end of each semester. Two exemptions will be given for 0 absences during a semester; one will be given for 1 or 2 absences during a semester.

HEB's Promotion/ Retention Policy

- Parents of 7th and 8th grade students, please be aware of the district promotion/ retention policy. All 7th and 8th grade students will be required to pass English, Math, Science and Social Studies to be promoted to the next grade.
- Failure to pass STAAR may result in retention in grades 7 and 8.
- 9th graders must earn
 credits before advancing to 10th grade.

Emotions in the Middle

Moody, private, self-conscious...if this sounds like your Jr. High student, you're not alone. At this age, his/her body and emotions are changing rapidly. Here are ways to help them cope.

Managing moods. Physical growth and worries about friends, sports, and schoolwork can cause moodiness. Let your child know you're available to talk. A quiet statement, such as "I remember what it feels like not to be asked to join a team," can invite him to open up about what's bothering him.

Finding privacy. It's natural for your youngster to want some time to herself. She might close her bedroom door or walk outside to take a phone call, for example. Show her that you respect her growing need for privacy by giving her space.

Fitting in. Many Jr. High students feel self-conscious. Being part of a group of people who share their interests can help your children focus on their strengths and feel more confident. Encourage them to participate in at least one activity (basketball team, student government, math club, etc.)


