


# THE STALLION STAMPEDE

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## COVID-19 UPDATES & REMINDERS


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- If your student is awaiting a COVID 19 test or test results, please do not send your student to school until you receive the test results.

# BLACKOUT POETRY WITH MRS. CREWS






Blackout poetry is a form of found poetry and it is a great opportunity for students to be really creative while creating something new out of something that already exists.

*Come with me...*




I will do my part,




