On Thursday during 2nd period, in person students will return their school issued devices and chargers. Virtual students will return their school issued devices and chargers after early release and lunches Thursday 1 pm to 6 pm through a drive through return at the front of the school. Lost power cords are \$30 for Chromebooks, \$40 for laptops. If screens are damaged the charge is \$150, and if the device is lost, the cost will be \$325 for Chromebooks and \$600 for laptops. Any lost or damaged item fees will be assessed and invoiced and any unpaid fees will affect your child's ability to be issued devices from the school this Fall.

2021 VIRTUAL CAREER FAIR FOR HEB ISD STUDENTS

To All HEB ISD Grade 6-12 Parents and Families:

This message includes information about OPTIONAL COVID-19 vaccination opportunities for HEB ISD students age 12 or older.

The FDA and CDC have now authorized the COVID-19 vaccine from Pfizer for use with adolescents ages 12 and older. This message includes information about local vaccination opportunities we are currently aware of, through Star Wellness, Texas Health, and Tarrant County Public Health.

All three providers have already provided vaccinations for many of our staff and students. Each vaccine provider's process can vary, but these requirements are generally true for each opportunity:

- Students must be at least 12 years of age to receive this vaccination and cannot have had another vaccination in the past 14 days (flu, tetanus, etc.). Some providers may have additional restrictions.
- A parent or guardian must attend each vaccination with their student. Some vaccination providers may require the student's birth certificate or other documentation -- please check with the provider for questions about document requirements.
- If the student has health insurance, he or she should bring his or her health insurance card. (If the student is not insured, the vaccination will still be free of charge.)
- In most cases, you will receive your second dose of the vaccine through the same provider as your first dose.

Star Wellness - COVID-19 Vaccine Opportunity

Parents or guardians may contact Star Wellness directly to arrange a vaccination opportunity for students age 12 or older.

Parent must be present. Vaccine recipients cannot be pregnant or have had any other vaccine in the past 14 days (flu, tetanus, etc.). Anyone interested needs to call Star Wellness to get on the list for the day that works best for them. They need to bring an ID and insurance card if they have insurance. COVID shots are free for everyone, even those without insurance. Please call Star Wellness at 817-571-6425 for more information.

Texas Health - COVID-19 Vaccine Opportunity

Texas Health's Community Vaccine Clinics are now offering vaccines to students 12 years of age and older. The vaccines are free and are available to all, regardless of immigration status and without the need for a photo ID.

All individuals under the age of 18 must be accompanied by a parent or guardian in order to receive the vaccine at a Texas Health Community Vaccine Clinic. In addition to students, vaccines are available to parents and other family members.

Walk-Ins are welcome or you may skip the line and expedite your visit by scheduling your FIRST dose of the COVID-19 vaccine.

Tarrant County - COVID-19 Vaccine Opportunity

COVID-19 vaccinations will be available from Tarrant County Public Health for everyone 12 years of age and older beginning Thursday, May 13. Parents will need to bring a birth certificate or another document with the child's date of birth. Parents need to bring their IDs as well.

Yes, 9th graders can be part of a Trinity High School team! An affordable distance running sport, Cross Country is easy to join! When you sign up, you will automatically become a member of the team, even if you have never done it before! Our practices are in the mornings before school at 6:45AM so we do not interfere with most other activities and classes on campus. In fact, you don't even have to be in the "Cross Country Class" period because of the before school practices. This allows you more opportunities to take classes that you need while still participating in an extracurricular activity! Make sure to read the 9th grade participation information that is linked at the bottom of this page.

Cross Country is both a team and individual sport. Practices and the meets are outside! This is a nice way to participate safely in a school activity. One of the best reasons to join Cross Country is that you get to be part of the well-respected Trinity Athletic Program!

Finally, Cross Country is a no-cut sport, meaning there are no "try-outs." If you are academically eligible, you are on the team!
