



Dear Parents,

We would like for you to be aware of a new TikTok challenge that is personally affecting our students and our school, as well as schools across the country.

"Devious Licks" is the name of the social media challenge and the goal is for students to steal and damage items from schools. [You can read more about it here on People.com.](#)

As you may or may not know, our school was recently renovated (right before COVID) and it is such a beautiful upgrade. We have all been very happy to be able to provide our students with a nice updated and remodeled environment. What students are doing to our school because of this challenge is not only disrespectful, it is illegal and dangerous. Students often participate in these types of challenges as a way to gain attention and popularity with friends and on social media, without fully realizing that it is illegal and can have real life short and long term consequences. Please remind your children that this is not okay. Please remind your children that even though stuff like this may get them attention, it is not the type of attention that they want to be receiving.

Failure to report witnessing destruction of property like this is also not okay and students have been facing the repercussions of that.

Below we will share information that Crime Stoppers of Tarrant County has shared about the "Devious Lick" challenge. There is an icon on every student's Classlink page called "Friends for Life" that links them to the Crime Stoppers of Tarrant County page, where students and adults can easily share anonymous tips. We have shared all of this information with our students this week.

"Devious Lick" Challenge

Today we're sending this email because at Crime Stoppers of Tarrant County we've been receiving a lot of anonymous tips about criminal acts related to the "Devious Lick" Challenge that originated from TikTok.

The "Devious Lick" challenge is a challenge in which an individual will attempt to "successfully" steal an item from the school that would usually be something hard and/or ridiculous to steal like soap dispensers, "Caution Wet Floor" signs, toilet paper holders, road signs, keyboards, computer monitors, and anything deemed significant enough for the challenge.

Many schools in our communities have experienced theft or vandalism of school property. We want you to know Crime Stoppers of Tarrant County is here to take ANONYMOUS tips that may be related to theft and/or vandalism that has been done in the name of this new TikTok trend.

CELEBRATING HISPANIC/LATINO HERITAGE MONTH




Sra. Soto kicked off Hispanic/Latino Heritage Month (September 15th to October 15th) by creating this fabulous and informative display in the languages hallway.


