



Your child is scheduled to take the upcoming STAAR/EOC Assessment appropriate for his/her grade level for the 2021-22 academic year.

House Bill 4545 requires students who do not pass STAAR/EOC assessments to complete thirty (30) hours of academic support in that content area. For most students, these hours of academic support are completed through our summer programs. Students in grade 6 will receive their academic support through placement in a STAAR class in grade 7.

*Please note that if a student does not take an assessment he/she cannot demonstrate appropriate grade-level performance and will have to complete the 30 hours. Academic support for House Bill 4545 will be offered:

> Grades 3-5 Math or Reading Grade 5 Science Grade 6-8 Math or Reading Grade 8 Science or Social Studies Any EOC content

Splash Pad Opens May 16 600 South Main Street Free

The South Euless Park Splash Pad is free, familyfriendly fun. No matter how hot it is outside, the Splash Pad provides an entertaining way for people of all ages to keep cool. These amenities are great for younger children because they do not present the same drowning hazard as swimming pools.

A magic touch bollard turns on the fun. Interactive spray elements are timed so water only runs when the sprayground is in use. There are several water effects for all children to play in including a raining bucket, an in-ground spray fountain, poles, a colorful misty arch, geysers and a spray column all located on a blue rubber surface.

The tropical landscaping includes banana trees and hardy hibiscus. Two benches and a beach hut shade structure provide a variety of places for parents to stay dry and supervise while children play.

The Splash Pad offers multiple spray features that provide a safe, no cost play environment for children to cool off during the hot weather. Simply press the top of the yellow bollard to start the water features. This facility is open to everyone and is not available to rent.

The H.E.B. Teen Court is looking for adult and teen volunteers. Volunteering for Teen Court is a great way to serve your community. The minimum age for teen volunteers is 13. Teens and adults work together to provide defendants the opportunity to take responsibility for their actions, while learning about the justice system. Teen volunteers learn public speaking skills, interviewing techniques and administrative skills. Local attorneys and the Teen Court Coordinator combine their time and talents to provide all teen volunteers with thorough training. Teen Court is a peer program that allows juvenile first offenders with Class C misdemeanors an alternative in the criminal justice system. Teen volunteers serve as the attorneys, bailiffs and clerks, while adult volunteers assist during court sessions as jury monitors and judges. 
