




FLU FACT

Q. When is the “official” influenza season?

A. Most influenza activity usually occurs from October to May in the United States even though influenza viruses have been detected year round.

A new influenza season begins the first week of October and goes through the third week in May. However, Texas conducts influenza surveillance year around.

Q. Do other respiratory viruses circulate during the flu season?

A. There can be other respiratory viruses that circulate during the flu season and can cause similar symptoms and illness as influenza. Some other respiratory viruses that may circulate during influenza season include:

- Rhinovirus,
- Respiratory Syncytial Virus (RSV),
- Adenovirus,
- Parainfluenza virus, and
- Coronavirus



Q. Why should people get vaccinated against the flu?

A. Influenza is a serious disease that can lead to hospitalization and sometimes death. Every flu season is different, and influenza infection can affect people differently. Even healthy people can get very sick from the flu and spread it to others. According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), an estimated 23,607 (range 3,349-48,614) influenza-associated deaths and over 200,000 influenza-associated hospitalizations occur every year in the United States.

During “flu season”, flu viruses are circulating at higher levels in the U.S. population. An annual seasonal flu vaccine is the best way to reduce the chances that you will get seasonal flu and spread it to others. When more people get vaccinated against the flu, less flu can spread through that community.





Possession of Telecommunications or Other Electronic Devices

Use of cell phones outside of individual classrooms will follow the guidelines below.

Grades 7-9 Students are required to keep their devices turned off and stored away during the school day. Cell phones may only be utilized in the classroom when the teacher deems appropriate as an instructional tool for educational purposes. Use of cell phones during passing periods and lunchtime will be an individual campus decision. Students who violate the campus policy will be subject to disciplinary actions.

Students shall not:

- Use a telecommunications device, including a cell phone, or other electronic device in violation of district and campus rules.
- Be in possession of cell phones during State Assessments, PSAT, SAT, ACT, AP AND IB tests.

Semester Exams:

Semester exams for the end of the first semester will be Tuesday, December 19th and Wednesday, December 20th.

A question we hear a lot this time of year

”Can my child take their final exams early?”

Unfortunately, students may NOT take exams early for any class. If a student is absent, they will receive a 50 for the semester exam grade. In order to replace the 50, they will then need to schedule a time to come in and take the exam after the Winter Break. Students will have one week (Jan. 9 through Jan. 16) to take the exam in order to replace the 50 as the semester exam and receive a correct finalized grade for the course.

Exam Exemptions:

The exam exemption list will be posted for students on Friday, December 15th. Students earn exam exemptions based on the following criteria:

Attendance Requirements

0-2 Absences = 2 Exemptions

3-4 Absences = 1 Exemption

5 or more absences = No Exemptions

An absence is defined as being in class for less than 26 minutes at the junior high level.

Any absence of one period or more will count against the exemption policy.

Tardies will be counted toward exemptions. Four tardies will count as one absence.

Participation in a school-sponsored activity, observance of a religious holy day, and funerals are the only absences that do not count against a student's exemption with proper documentation. No other exceptions will be made to this Exemption Policy.

Discipline Requirements

Students will lose their exam exemptions if the student:

Receives a disciplinary assignment to off-campus suspension (OSS) or alternate education program(s) [SOS and/or JJAEP] as well as ISS (In school suspension)

Grade Requirements

Students must have a grade of 80 or above for the class in order to use the exemption.
