Education Service Center-Region 19 COVID 19 On-Campus Attendance Plan El Paso, Texas

The local education agencies serving the El Paso and Hudspeth Counties also known as Region 19, in collaboration with the Texas Education Agency (TEA) and support from the El Paso Delegation and Health Authorities, initiated a plan to address the safety of students, teachers and school staff. The COVID-19 On-Campus Attendance Plan, released on October 23, 2020, outlines a plan to ensure the continuity of safe education during the pandemic. This partnership was opened for all Local Education Agencies (LEAs) within Region 19 to endorse the COVID-19 On-Campus Attendance Plan.

This collaboration builds a community of entities committed to respecting the revered nature of schools and support/developing good practices for protecting the health of the educational community. It offers guidance from the El Paso Health Authority, Dr. Hector Ocaranza and El Paso Public Health Director, Ms. Angela Mora through concrete measures that reduce the risk of the spread of COVID-19 in the El Paso and Hudspeth communities and mitigates the stressors being placed on our city's infrastructure.

As per conversations with the Commissioner, the Plan becomes the Region 19 waiver. We need your response to communicate with TEA that all Region 19 school districts and school systems agree with the proposed Plan to be used in lieu of an agency waiver. Please sign and return by 3pm today Monday, October 26th to compile and send responses to TEA.

COVID-19 On Campus Attendance Plan

El Paso, Texas (October 23, 2020)—Given the rise of COVID-19 cases and hospitalizations, Region 19 school districts, in collaboration with the Texas Education Agency (TEA) and support from the El Paso Delegation and Health Authorities, initiated a plan to address the safety of students, teachers and school staff. School districts will continue to offer remote instruction for all families. School districts will mitigate on-campus instruction based on tri-county hospitalization information from the Texas Department of State Health Services.

The hospitalization rates are categorized in four types of emergency percentage Zones which impact the day-to-day operations of school districts. The counties of El Paso, Hudspeth, and Culberson are currently in the Red Zone with a hospitalization rate of 32%.

All school systems in the region will take steps to implement this as a minimum framework no later than Monday, November 9, 2020. To assist with adoption, rapid COVID-19 testing will be made available for those districts to coincide with the start (or continuation of) on-campus instruction. Since we are currently in the Red Zone, any school system already offering on-campus instruction to priority students will have testing made available to them. As districts move into different Zones, testing will be made available for on-campus staff and students.

Funding, regardless of instructional delivery method offered, will continue.

Parents have choice of instructional delivery method



- Students with no internet access or device at home
- Students of families who lack effective childrane access
- Students of parents of essential workers
- Students with special academic needs





20% and above

- School systems may (but are not required to) restrict access to oncampus instruction for all grade levels
- On-campus instruction must still be provided for priority populations
 - On campus instruction must be provided at safe capacity levels of prority populations as determined by district/campus
- Priority high school students may be served via a hybrid schedule
- Priority middle school students may opt into a hybrid schedule



15% to 19.9%

- Daily on-campus instruction must be provided to all elementary (PK-5) students who wish to attend on-campus
- School systems may (but are not required to) restrict access to on-campus instruction at the middle and high school level
- Priority populations must be allowed within safe capacity
- Safe capacity is 50% students or may be greater as determined by district/campus.



10% to 14.9%

- Daily on-campus instruction must be provided to all students who wish to attend on-campus in all grade levels (elementary, middle, and high)
- Priority populations must be allowed within safe capacity
- Safe capacity is 75% students or may be greater as determined by district/campus



Below 10%

 100% of students who elect on-campus instruction must be allowed to be on-campus, in all grades, without restriction

ATTESTATION STATEMENT FOR ADA HOLD HARMLESS BEYOND THE FIRST TWO SIX-WEEK REPORTING PERIODS

SECTION I: Information

TEA has instituted the ADA hold harmless for the first two six-week attendance reporting periods. TEA will make available an ADA hold harmless for the third six-weeks attendance reporting period on the condition that LEAs allow on-campus instruction throughout the entire third six-weeks period. The ADA hold harmless methodology will be identical to the methodology used for the first two six-weeks attendance reporting periods, except that the third six-weeks will be examined independent of the first two six-weeks attendance reporting periods. Specifically, if an LEA's refined ADA counts during the third six-weeks attendance reporting periods are less than the ADA hold harmless projections, the third six-weeks attendance reporting periods for 2020–2021 will be excluded from the calculation of ADA and student FTEs for FSP funding purposes and will be replaced with the ADA hold harmless projections.

School systems are eligible for this hold harmless on the condition that all families who want their children to attend on campus within the LEA have the ability to do so each day that instruction is offered, subject to two exceptions. One exception is for students attending high school less than daily in districts that have been approved to offer a hybrid-only high school instructional setting, per the requirements described in question 11 in the Hybrid Attendance Requirements section of the SY 2020-21 Attendance and Enrollment FAQ document. The other exception is for school systems that choose to temporarily limit on-campus access for up to 5 days, due to a confirmed COVID-19 case on campus, per the requirements described in questions 12-14 in the Closure section of the SY 2020-21 Attendance and Enrollment FAQ document.

School systems that wish to receive this hold harmless must submit this attestation indicating that they will meet these oncampus instruction requirements for the entirety of the third six-weeks attendance reporting period. School systems that cannot meet these conditions will not be eligible for the hold harmless.
