Maximum Class Size Exceptions

A district must submit a request for a class size exception for any classrooms in kindergarten - fourth grade that exceed the 22 students class size limit (Texas Education Code §25.112 (http://www.statutes.legis.state.tx.us/Docs/ED/htm/ED.25.htm#25.112)). A district seeking an exemption must notify the commissioner and apply for the exemption not later than the later of (1) October 1; or 2) the 30th day after the first school day the district exceeds the limit. Note: class size limits do not apply to physical education classes or fine arts classes.

Class size limitations generally apply throughout the school year, with the exceptions noted below:

- Any twelve-week period selected by the district with a significant percentage of migratory children (25.112(1)), or
- · The last twelve weeks of any school year for all other districts

In considering whether to grant an exception, the commissioner must find that the class size limit creates an undue hardship on the district. The commissioner will consider such things as unanticipated enrollment growth, lack of facilities, lack of teachers, or financial hardships.

Please note that an exception granted expires at the end of the school year.

Notifying Parents of an Exception

A campus or district that is granted a class size exception shall provide written notice of the exception to the parent (or person standing in parental relation to) of each student affected by the exception. The notice must be in bold or underlined print and must:

- specify the particular class for which a class size exception was granted,
- state the number of students in the class for which the exception was granted, and
- be delivered through regular mail or other means of communication from the campus or district, such as information sent home with students.

The notice described above must be provided no later than the 31st day after the first day of the school year, or the date the exception is granted, if the exception is granted after the beginning of the school year. The district must maintain documentation of the notices provided to parents, subject to a request

Re: Quarterly Investment Report

The Quarterly Investment Report for the period ending November 30, 2020 is attached. Total investments increased from the end of the last quarter by \$1,569,356.89 as a result of regular district operations including foundation deposits.

As you may recall from our investment policy, the goals of our investment policy are safety, liquidity, and finally, yield. With safety as a number one priority, FISD continues to sweep excess cash balances daily into our Investment Pools that are yielding an average of 0.12% for the Government Overnight Fund and 0.19% for the Corporate Overnight Plus Fund for the quarter.

As indicated in previous reports, our district invests cash that we will not need immediately in the Lone Star Investment Pool. At the end of September 2020, average yields at the investment pools ranged from 0.15% to a 0.12%. Yields through November 2020, decreased. As has been the case for the last year, we continue to see little or no growth in yields with little expectation for significant increases in interest revenue in the near future.



Quarterly Position Report November 30, 2020



The yield curve steepened modestly in the three-month period ending in November as longer-term yields rose 10 to 15 basis points. Despite a selloff in late October, equity prices finished the period higher due to a strong rally in November. The second estimate of third quarter GDP rose by 33.1% vs 32.0% expected. GDP remained 2.9% below the third quarter last year. Expectations are for economic activity to expand in the fourth quarter of 2020, but total growth for 2020 to contract by approximately 3.5%.

In 2021, a widely available vaccine by mid-year should help lead to a solid economic rebound. The consumer confidence index has been unable to sustain upward momentum; the index missed estimates, falling to 96.1, and is still far from February's 132.6. At the FOMC meeting in November, the Fed indicated that the economy had recovered substantially during the summer, but was still far from pre-COVID levels.



Update 116 Local Policy Overview

December 11, 2020

Introduction

Update 116 includes recommended (LOCAL) policy revisions concerning the dismissal appeal process for employees, cybersecurity training, student medical treatment, and community conduct on school premises.

While not covered in this publication, many of the (LEGAL) policies included in this update were affected by recent changes to Administrative Code rules or legislation from the 86th Legislative Session that will be effective as of January 1, 2021.

TASB Numbered Update Reminders

You should also review your own district's customized Update 116 materials for your specific policy recommendations. Please remember that (LEGAL) policies provide the legal framework for key areas of district operations; they are not adopted by the board.

CQB: Technology Resources, Cybersecurity

Current state law requires the board to select a cybersecurity training program and to verify and report cybersecurity training completed by employees. To ease compliance with this law, the recommend revision delegates these responsibilities to the superintendent.

DCD: Employment Practices, At-Will Employment DCE: Employment Practices, Other Types of Contracts

Most districts have adopted an employee complaint policy that can be found at DGBA(LOCAL). It establishes a process that an employee would follow before a complaint is heard by the board.

Both DCD(LOCAL) and DCE(LOCAL) reference DGBA under the sections that address appeals. The recommended revisions are intended to clarify that an at-will employee who is dismissed or a non-Chapter 21 contract employee whose contract is not reissued would follow the grievance process as outlined in policy DGBA, including proceeding through the relevant hearing levels before a complaint goes to the board.

FFAC: Wellness and Health Services, Medical Treatment

Substantial revisions at policy FFAC(LOCAL) are recommended:



- To align the policy with current Texas Department of State Health Services (DSHS) guidance;
- To include only those board-level decisions that should be reflected in policy; and
- To remove provisions that are more appropriate in the district's administrative regulations.

Recommended for removal from this policy and inclusion in the district's regulations are administrative details concerning:

- How the district responds when a student becomes ill;
- What steps to take when a student is involved in an accident; and
- Requirements for administering medication provided by parents.

Some districts have policies that would permit the district to purchase nonprescription medication for use in the district athletic program. Special provisions are included in those districts' policies to address this practice.

In accordance with DSHS guidance, however, in most districts' policies the text now reflects that the district shall not otherwise purchase nonprescription medication to administer to students.

Districts also have the option to purchase unassigned, prescription epinephrine auto-injectors and unassigned, prescription asthma medications. If your district purchases epinephrine auto-injectors or asthma medication, state law requires board-adopted policy. Please contact your policy consultant if your district currently purchases these specific prescription medications or if your district purchases nonprescription medications not currently reflected in policy.

The provisions covering medical treatment have also been updated to clarify who may complete the medical treatment authorization form and to reflect that the district will seek appropriate emergency care for a student as required or deemed necessary.

GKA: Community Relations, Conduct on School Premises

The recommended revision in this policy specifies that a person filing a complaint regarding refusal of entry to or ejection from property based on Education Code 37.105 shall be permitted to address the board within 90 "calendar" days unless the complaint is resolved before coming to the board.

Each time TASB Policy Service updates the model policies, your district has a new opportunity to review TASB's recommendations and consider, or revisit, your local policy choices. The purpose of this memorandum is to identify to the board potential legal problems and best practices that may arise as a result of the district's unique local choices in the policy codes affected by Update 116.

Please note that your district may not have locally developed provisions in a policy code affected by Update 116 as addressed by this memo. For each policy code in which your district does have locally developed provisions or is considering adopting local changes to the TASB model policy, we suggest you review the recommendations below. You can identify a policy with locally developed provisions by looking at the bottom of the policy. A policy that is unique to the district will be indicated with an "X" by the policy code in the footer ("___(LOCAL)-X," for example). A TASB-recommended policy will be indicated by any letter other than an "X" ("___(LOCAL)-A," for example).

In addition, the last paragraphs of this memorandum address general policy writing tips to keep in mind when making any policy revisions.

I. Common Legal Issues in Revising Update 116 Local Policies DCD(LOCAL)—Employment Practices: At-Will Employment

Due process for at-will employees

 COMMON ISSUE: Local policy indicates that a district will follow procedures before dismissing an at-will employee.

This policy provides a process that the superintendent or administration must follow before dismissing an at-will employee. This policy is not legally required; at-will employees are not entitled to due process. Moreover, this policy interferes with the administration's ability to act quickly in terminating at-will employees, including when a staff member's conduct raises safety issues. Finally, at-will employees may seek review of their terminations through the grievance process.

• **LEGAL TIP:** Local policy should not reference due process in the at-will employment context.

Progressive discipline in board policy

 COMMON ISSUE: Local policy indicates that a district will deal with misconduct through progressive discipline.

Local policy should not set out a system of progressive discipline for employee misconduct. This system could create a perception that an employee cannot be terminated for a single violation. Moreover, including progressive discipline in policy is not necessary since the different discipline options are available even if not listed in policy. Progressive discipline is better addressed in the employee handbook or other administrative regulations. If the district chooses to retain this policy, we recommend that the policy be amended to specify that the progressive system is optional and that the district reserves the right to terminate based on a single incident.

• LEGAL TIP: Do not reference a progressive discipline system in board policy.

DCE(LOCAL)—Employment Practices: Other Types of Contracts

No Chapter 21 contract for full-time LVNs

• **COMMON ISSUE:** Local policy provides non-Chapter 21 contracts to full-time licensed vocational nurses (LVNs).

Texas law is unclear regarding whether only registered nurses (RNs) are entitled to Chapter 21 contracts or whether the term "nurse" in Chapter 21 also includes LVNs.

The commissioner of education has concluded that, for purposes of the state minimum salary schedule, only an RN who is hired to provide full-time nursing and health-care services is a "school nurse." Tex. Educ. Code § 21.402(a); Watkins v. Longview Indep. Sch. Dist., Tex. Comm'r of Educ. Decision No. 073-R10-200 (Sept. 6, 2000); 19 Tex. Admin. Code § 153.1022(a)(1)(D). The Texas Education Code provisions governing Chapter 21 contracts use the term "nurse" not "school nurse."

Districts must employ by Chapter 21 contract all full-time professional employees whose positions require certification by the State Board for Educator Certification (SBEC). Tex. Educ. Code §§ 21.101, .151, .201. On the one hand, LVNs are not typically considered "professional" employees. On the other hand, LVNs are required to hold a certification. If your district does not issue Chapter 21 contracts to LVNs, we suggest that you confirm this choice with your school attorney.

• **LEGAL TIP:** Consult your school attorney if the district wishes to employ LVNs at-will or under non-Chapter 21 contracts.

No Chapter 21 contract for persons in positions requiring certification

• **COMMON ISSUE:** Local policy provides for noncertified contracts for employees in positions requiring certification.

If employees are employed in positions requiring certification, local policy should not authorize employment under non-Chapter 21, or noncertified, contracts. The Texas Education Code requires districts to employ by probationary, term, or continuing contracts (Chapter 21 contracts) all full-time professional employees whose positions require certification. Tex. Educ. Code §§ 21.101, .151, .201; see also Landers v. Round Rock Indep. Sch. Dist., Tex. Comm'r of Educ. Decision No. 032-R1-1101 (Jan. 9, 2002) (defining administrator as "teacher" because contract required certification); Smith v. Zapata Cnty. Indep. Sch. Dist., Tex. Comm'r of Educ. Decision No. 088-R2-498 (Aug. 12, 1999), upheld on other grounds, Smith v. Nelson, 53 S.W.3d 792 (Tex. App.—Austin 2001, pet. denied) (finding athletic director entitled to probationary contract because job posting required certification). This may include administrators, educational diagnosticians, and persons required by local policy to hold certificates.

 LEGAL TIP: Consult your school attorney if the district wishes to employ full-time professional employees whose positions require certification under non-Chapter 21 contracts.

FFAC(LOCAL)—Wellness and Health Services: Medical Treatment

Policy includes provisions regarding administration of medication provided by district

 COMMON ISSUE: Local policy includes provisions on district-provided medicine that do not reflect best practices.

If a district includes policy provisions related to distribution of nonprescription medicine, such language should reflect Texas Department of State Health Services (TDSHS) guidance and provisions in the Texas Education Code. Texas Education Code section 22.052 provides immunity from damages or injuries resulting from the administration of medication, but only in limited circumstances. If the district intends to provide over-the-counter medication, it should consider using language available from TASB Policy Service.

• **LEGAL TIP:** If the district intends to administer medication provided by the district, check with your policy consultant.

Policy deletes 504 plan and IEP language or allows nurse to refuse

• **COMMON ISSUE:** Local policy does not include language requiring district personnel to follow a student's individualized education program (IEP) or Section 504 plan and/or adds language about a nurse refusing to comply with a plan.

A district should not remove TASB-recommended language providing that district personnel will administer herbal substances or dietary substances required by an IEP or Section 504 plan for a student. The district is still obligated to comply with any requirements of these plans, including the administration of plan-recommended medication. *Cedar Rapids Cmty. Sch. Dist. v. Garret ex rel. Charlene F.*, 526 U.S. 66 (1999). TASB Legal Services recommends that the district include this language in its policy.

For similar reasons, TASB Legal Services does not recommend establishing policy procedures for when a school nurse declines to administer medication based on his or her determination that it is not in the best interest of the student. Because the district is obligated to comply with requirements in a student's IEP or Section 504 plan, including the administration of plan-recommended medication, we recommend that the district appoint another employee to administer the medication if a nurse declines. The district may also wish to convene an admission, review, and dismissal (ARD) committee meeting to discuss the medication issue.

• **LEGAL TIP:** Include TASB-recommended language that personnel will follow an IEP or Section 504 plan without exception.

Herbal substance administration without 504 plan or IEP language

 COMMON ISSUE: Local policy allows district personnel to administer herbal substances or dietary supplements not covered by an IEP or Section 504 plan.

Local policy should not allow employees to administer herbal substances or dietary supplements to students upon a parent's written request, regardless of whether the substance is properly labeled and in the original container. The Texas Education Code gives district employees immunity from civil liability for administering medication to students under certain conditions. Tex. Educ. Code § 22.052. Because herbal medicines and dietary supplements are not regulated by the federal Food and Drug Administration (FDA), they may not be considered "medication" under the statute and, therefore, district employees may not have immunity for administering them. We recommend that these substances be administered by district personnel only if required by a student's IEP or Section 504 plan.

• **LEGAL TIP:** Local policy should not authorize administration of herbal substances or dietary supplements if not required by a student's IEP or Section 504 plan.

GKA(LOCAL)—Community Relations: Conduct on School Premises

TASB Policy GKA concerns the conduct of visitors to school property. The policy addresses what items are prohibited on school property and provides the authority to exclude individuals from school property under certain circumstances. If you are considering adding local language to this code not covered in the TASB model policy, you may want to look at our TASB School Law eSource guidance on:

- Firearms and knives
- <u>Visitors</u> to school property
- Distribution of literature on school property

II. General Policy Development Tips

Creating local policies for school district operations is one of the board's most important roles. Through developing strong board policies, a district can communicate a coherent educational mission and provide clear guidance to help employees implement their duties lawfully and consistently. Good local policies can also reduce the risk of legal challenges. In order to be effective, a board policy must be written as clearly as possible. TASB Legal Services offers the following suggestions as general guidance when a board is considering local policy language.

Locally Defined Terms

As a general matter, school boards should avoid creating local definitions of terms that are defined differently in statute or through case law. For example, policies sometimes attempt to define the circumstances that can lead to a contract employee's termination for good cause. When a contract employee requests a hearing under Chapter 21, however, "good cause" is determined first by an independent hearing examiner based on previous termination cases and legal precedent. Other terms like "fraud" are defined in the Texas Penal Code. In the context of student and employee searches, the term "reasonable suspicion" means something very different from "probable cause." Creating local definitions that conflict even slightly with legally defined terms can inject confusion into local decision-making.

Mixing the (LEGAL) with the (LOCAL)

The district's policy manual contains both "legal" and "local" policies. Legal policies are restatements of the current law as it relates to Texas school districts generally. Occasionally, a district chooses to incorporate language from a legal policy into its local policy. Unique local policy provisions may not be automatically updated when the law changes. Absent diligent administrative review by the district, any change in state or federal law could cause the district's local policy to be out of date and conflict with governing law. TASB Legal Services recommends that school districts avoid reciting or summarizing legal policy language in local policy.

It is vital that boards not adopt legal policies. Legal policies contain citations to the statutes, rules, and case law governing a particular topic. They are compiled by TASB Legal Services and Policy Service to provide the legal framework for key areas of district operations. Legal policies reflect current law and are updated by TASB as the laws change. Legal and local policies function differently, and it is imperative that only local policies should be acted upon when a board updates policy.

Resolution of the Fabens Independent School Board of Trustees Regarding Extension of Time to Use Emergency Paid Sick Leave for the 2020-2021 School Year

WHEREAS, on March 13, 2020, the President of the United States issued a Proclamation on Declaring a National Emergency Concerning the Novel Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19) Outbreak;

WHEREAS, the Board and Administration are following advice and directives from federal, state and local authorities in responding to the COVID-19 pandemic;

WHEREAS, the Families First Coronavirus Response Act ("FFCRA") authorized two temporary leave benefits, including expanded FMLA leave entitlement ("Expanded FMLA") and up to 80 hours of emergency paid sick leave ("EPSL") for specified reasons related to COVID-19;

WHEREAS, the entitlements under the FFCRA apply from April 2, 2020 through December 31, 2020;

WHEREAS, the Board has a substantial public interest in protecting the health and safety of its students, staff, and community and, finds that a need exists to extend until the 2020-2021 school year, the ability of employees to avail themselves of up to 80 hours of EPSL; and

WHEREAS, the Board finds that the public purposes described above are fulfilled by efficiently and effectively making certain delegations, as described more fully herein, to the Superintendent to address this everchanging emergency situation in the best interest of the health, safety, and well-being of its students, staff, community, and the citizenship at-large.

IT IS THEREFORE RESOLVED BY THE FABENS INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT BOARD OF TRUSTEES THAT:

All the above recitals are adopted as findings of fact and are incorporated into and made a part of this resolution for all purposes. In furtherance of these public purposes, the Board of Trustees makes the following delegations to the Superintendent during the 2020-2021 school year:

1. The authority, in the event the FFCRA authorization of EPSL is not extended by Congress, to continue to offer employees EPSL for the reasons as currently authorized in the FFCRA through the end of June 30, 2021 ("District EPSL");



- 2. The authority to act in place of the Board under Policy DEC (Local) regarding modification of employee leave days and/or creating guidelines for changes regarding use of employee absences under District EPSL, including but not limited to determining compensation entitlements of any employee who uses District EPSL and the authority to determine the required documentation for District EPSL eligibility.
- 3. This resolution does not extend any Expanded FMLA provisions of the FFCRA. Therefore, if such benefits are not extended by Congress, they will cease on December 31, 2020.

RESOLUTION OF THE FABENS INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT BOARD OF TRUSTEES

REQUESTING GOVERNOR ABBOTT TO INCLUDE PUBLIC SCHOOL DISTRICT PERSONNEL IN THE OFFICIAL EXPERT VACCINE ALLOTMENT PANEL'S DEFINITION OF FRONTLINE WORKERS

WHEREAS, the Fabens Independent School District Board of Trustees (Board) recognizes that the United States Government, the State of Texas and Local Health Authorities have declared a disaster and emergency regarding Coronavirus/COVID-19 (hereafter "COVID-19") and its spread across the State and Nation and continue to extend these declarations;

WHEREAS, the Board recognizes that COVID-19 is an unforeseen and unavoidable emergency of urgent public necessity, that the World Health Organization has declared COVID-19 a pandemic, and that additional emergency declarations have been and will continue to be issued in the coming days, weeks, and months;

WHEREAS, the Public Schools of the State of Texas impact millions of students and personnel and have a profound effect on educational, social, economic and public health issues and are integral to the general welfare of the State;

WHEREAS, the Public Schools of the State of Texas are charged with the task of caring for educating, nourishing and providing extra-curricular activities to millions of Texas students five days a week thus allowing a vast number of parents the opportunity to engage in gainful employment to support and nurture wholesome home environments for our Texas students;

WHEREAS, the Public Schools of the State of Texas are dependent on dedicated school personnel from administrators, teachers, educational and professional specialists to clerical, maintenance, transportation, child nutrition, security and other support staff to conduct the day-to-day operations of our schools and ensure the goal of efficient delivery of instruction;

WHEREAS, although our District and our personnel as well as districts across the State have responded heroically to the challenges brought forth by COVID-19 regarding the delivery of instruction, issues persist in the quality of learning, especially among students that would most benefit from live, face-to-face instruction:

WHEREAS, a substantial number of school district employees are more susceptible to complication and/or death from COVID-19 due to age or pre-existing medical conditions;

WHEREAS, the Board having a substantial public interest in protecting the health and safety of its staff, students and community, therefore, desires to ensure that the school district and community be prepared to the fullest extent possible in light of COVID-19;

WHEREAS, it appears that through the significant efforts of the public and private sectors, effective vaccines may soon be available to administer to our citizens in an effort to thwart the spread of the COVID-19 pandemic and return our lives to a semblance of normality and stability;

WHEREAS, the State of Texas convened a team of external and internal subject-matter experts into the Expert Vaccine Allocation Panel to develop vaccine allocation strategies as recommendations to the Texas Commissioner of Health, including guiding principles for the equitable distribution of the vaccine across the State which appropriately prioritizes making vaccines available to FRONTLINE WORKERS and vulnerable populations;

WHEREAS, in order to balance the educational, health and economic issues described above, the Governor of Texas, the Texas Commissioner of Education and the Texas Education Agency prescribed guidelines and directives to Public School Districts to currently make available live instruction to those students who request it and to continue to aggressively phase in live instruction for all students in the near future;

WHEREAS, the Board and Administration are following advice and directive from federal, state and local authorities in responding to COVID-19;

WHEREAS, Texas Public School District personnel are essential to the day-to-day operations of a district as described above and critical for the resumption of live, face-to-face instruction;

WHEREAS, the Texas Association of School Boards (TASB) and the Texas Association of School Administrators (TASA) recently requested of Governor Abbott that school district employees statewide be defined as FRONTLINE WORKERS for purpose of vaccine allocation.

IT IS THEREFORE RESOLVED THAT the Board of Trustees finds a substantial public purpose exists in requesting of the Governor and Expert Vaccine Allocation Panel that all Public School District personnel be designated Frontline Workers as that term is defined by the Expert Vaccine Allocation Panel and as essential Frontline Workers be given appropriate priority in the statewide administration of the COVID-19 vaccine as it becomes available.
