NOTICE TO EMPLOYEES AND STUDENTS

Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973

Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 prohibits discrimination on the basis of a disability.

No otherwise qualified individual with a disability shall, solely by reason of her or his disability, be excluded from the participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under any program or activity receiving Federal financial assistance.

Definitions

There are three ways that a person may qualify under the regulations. A person is considered disabled under Section 504 if s/he meets one or more of the following definitions:

<u>Individual with a Disability:</u> "Any person who (i) has a physical or mental impairment which substantially limits one or more major life activities, (ii) has a record of such an impairment, or (iii) is regarded as having such an impairment." 34 CFR §104.3(j) (1).

Major Life Activities: "Functions such as caring for one's self, performing manual tasks, walking, seeing, hearing, speaking, breathing, learning, working, eating, sleeping, standing, lifting, bending, reading, concentrating, thinking and communicating." 34 CFR §104.3(j) (2) (ii). (Note - This is a sample of activities and not a comprehensive list).

Qualified §504 Student: A student whose mental or physical impairment substantially limits a major life activity is a "qualified" 504 student if he is between the ages of 3 and 21, inclusive. 34 CFR §104.3(k) (2); Education Code 21.031(b).

§504 Legal Obligations

<u>Nondiscrimination:</u> "No qualified person with a disability shall, on the basis of disability, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or otherwise be subjected to discrimination under any program or activity which received or benefits from Federal financial assistance." 34 CFR §104.4(a).
