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# Brockton Public Schools



Brockton School Nurses are integral members of the educational team who assist children and youth to develop their full potential. Our school health program strives to meet the individual needs of each student. The cooperative efforts of the parent, administrator, nurse, health care provider, teacher, support personnel and the student contribute to the success of our program. Our priorities as professional nurses include the education, integration and coordination of the health needs of all students.

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## ROLE OF THE PARENT/GUARDIAN

### THE NURSES OFFICE NEEDS

- ◇ Signed emergency form filled out completely
- ◇ Medical conditions: If your child has any medical issues please contact your school nurse.

### MEDICATION POLICY

To ensure the health and safety of the students needing medication in school:

1. Any medications given in school need to have signed parent/doctor forms.
2. Contact the school nurse before bringing in medication. The school nurse will provide the required doctors and parents forms.
3. All medication must be delivered by a parent or responsible adult in the original prescription labeled bottle.
4. Medication is not administered on early dismissal days.
5. Medications should be given at home when able.

### PHYSICALS

All students must provide a physical examination upon school entry and every three years. Sports physicals within thirteen months, of participating in any sport. A report of this physical examination must be on file in the nurse's office.

- Required physicals Upon Entry & Sports + Preschool/kindergarten, Grades 4, 7, 11
- Your provider should do a TB Risk screening

## SCHOOL HEALTH SERVICES



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### SCREENINGS

- Vision screening in Grades PreK-5, 7, 9 & referrals as needed.
- Hearing screening in Grades K-3 7, 9 & referrals as needed.
- Postural screening in Grades 5 - 9
- SBIRT screenings in grades 7 & 9
- Annual height and weight in Grades 1,4,7& 9.

### SICK DAY PROTOCOL

- Communicable disease (doctor's note required)
- Five day absences (doctor's note/school nurse clearance required for re-entry)
- Follow up referrals
- Fever over 100.0 stay home until fever free for 24 hours without medication.
- Vomiting/Diarrhea stay home until stopped for 24 hours.

### OTHER RESPONSIBILITIES

- Home tutor referrals
- Individual health care plans
- Conferences / team meetings with parents, school personnel & community providers
- Statistical analysis

### COMMUNICATION

- Medical status and changes regarding student's health should be shared with the school nurse on a routine basis.
- In order to keep your child's school health record current, please have a physical exam form completed by your child's primary care provider and returned to school each time your child sees a provider of care.
- Any time your child sees a medical provider or is hospitalized for a serious condition please update your school nurse and provide any paperwork given to you.
