BASIC SCOPE AND NEEDS OF THE CONTRACT:

Pursuant to Education Code sections 17250.10 et seq., the Oakland Unified School District seeks a design-build entity to produce final designs for, and construct, the classroom building at the Coliseum College Preparatory Academy ("CCPA") campus, at 3190 66th Avenue, Oakland, California 94621 (the "Project"). The Contract will be constructed on the southwest portion of the campus, as set forth in the attached Exhibit A. The scope of the Contract will be a two-story modular classroom building comprised of 14 standard classrooms and 2 laboratory classrooms (see *Exhibit A*). Procurement of the Project's design-build entity will be issued by the District under a separate RFQ. As set forth herein, the design-build entity for the modular building will be responsible for the design and coordination of their final design with the Project design-build entity in order to obtain final Division of the State Architect ("DSA") approval. No construction work shall be performed until the design-build entity receives written approval of the plans, as to the safety of design and construction, from the DSA.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION:

Coliseum College Preparatory Academy ("CCPA") is situated on an existing campus of which was formerly known as Havenscourt Middle School, located at 3190 66th Avenue in Oakland, California. Presently, the campus comprises of six permanent buildings: Building "M" (a 2-story administration and classroom building); Buildings "A", "B" and "C" (three one-story classroom buildings); Building "G" (a one-story gymnasium); Building "D" (a two-story cafeteria and classroom building); and eight classroom portables.

With a projected increase in the number of students to be served by the school, the campus necessitates additional classrooms. The District has retained the services of an architectural firm to produce bridging documents. In line with the programmatic requirements, the proposed project involves a new two-story modular building which would house fourteen standard classrooms and two laboratory classrooms, a gymnasium, and a reconfiguration of the existing parking lot. The overall project scope would include but not be limited to demolition of the current gymnasium and the eight classroom portables, infrastructure improvements, construction

of a new two-story tower with restrooms, stairway, corridor and a two-stop elevator, and the addition of outdoor features such as landscaping, seating, and activity areas.

Project Delivery will utilize an Alternative Design-Build Entity process for the overall project and a Standard Design-Build Entity process for the modular building manufacturer. The Project as a whole will require integrating the documents produced by two DBE entities into a single DSA submittal package.

ACADEMIC PROGRAM:

The proposed space program for CCPA is driven by the school leadership's vision for the academic program. The core of this vision is an excellence in A-G core requirements with additional college and career readiness Pathways and wraparound services that serve the whole student. The target enrollment for the school is 960 students, which is above the District's threshold for a financially sustainable community school. OUSD High Schools of this size are intended to provide spaces for are delineated in the bridging document

MEASURE Y DESIGN-BUILD PROJECT:

The Measure Y-funded project is being delivered via Alternative Design-Build and Standard Design-Build methods.

- 1. Shah Kawasaki Architects. the District's architect, worked with the school community to develop the Bridging Documents with Schematic Designs consisting of building system concepts, project phasing, and design criteria documents.
- 2. The Bridging Documents will be issued to the prequalified DBEs during the RFP phase.
- 3. The Bridging Documents are intended to serve as the basis of a Request for Qualifications/Request for Proposals process that the District will use to select a Design-Build Entity (DBE). Following the selection, the DBE will provide full design services including, but not limited to, Schematic Design verification, production of Construction Documents, and securing approval of the design by the Division of the State Architect.
- 4. While the overall project timing is contingent upon numerous factors, it is anticipated that construction could begin in 2025 and achieve substantial completion in 2026.
- 5. It will be necessary to phase the project such that no off-site relocation of students is required, as there are no facilities available locally to house them. Spaces currently in the existing buildings shall serve as interim housing for student activities during construction

RECOMMENDED PROJECT PHASING:

To ensure an efficient and systematic construction process, it is recommended that the DBE prioritize the following phases:

Phase 1: Construction Laydown Area and Classroom Building & Gymnasium Building – In this phase, the focus should be on constructing the laydown area to provide a designated space for

material storage and equipment. Simultaneously, construction of the Classroom Building and Gymnasium Building should commence to establish the core facilities of the project.

Phase 2: Demolition of Existing Gymnasium & Portable Classrooms, and Construction Laydown Area – Once Phase 1 is completed, the existing Gymnasium and 8 Portable Classrooms can be demolished to make way for further development. Additionally, the construction laydown area that served its purpose in Phase 1 can be safely demolished to free up space for future outdoor improvements.

Phase 3: Outdoor Improvements – With demolition and construction laydown area completed, Phase 3 can focus on outdoor improvements. This may include landscaping, parking lot construction, and other enhancements to the project's exterior.

Work from different phases can be pursued concurrently, depending on the project's specific requirements and available resources.

ONGOING COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT:

The Bridging Documents will reflect the basis of design from stakeholder engagements. It is the District's intent that the DBE shall continue the engagements with the parties referenced below throughout the project's life cycle from design through construction.

Activity 1: Additional public community meetings

Activity 2: Formation of focus groups for engagement on specific space types

Activity 3: Outreach to CCPA feeder schools

Activity 4: Partner with students and local artists to produce murals or other public are on campus.

CONSTRUCTION BUDGET OF THE PROJECT: The Board of Education approved construction budget is \$44M for the entire Project. The estimated construction cost for the modular classroom building only is \$28M.

DESIGN-BUILD ENTITY PREQUALIFICATION:

From the design-build entities that submit statements of qualifications, the District will determine which entities shall be prequalified, or short-listed, for this Contract. Only design-build entities that are prequalified or short-listed pursuant to Education Code section 17250.25 will be allowed to submit bids or proposals.

A design-build entity will not be eligible to be prequalified or short-listed if the entity, or any consultant or contractor to the entity, participated in the preparation of this Request for Qualifications or the Request for Bids or Proposals (including the District's requirements for the design [the "Design Requirements" or "Bridging Documents"]) for the Contract.

Any statement of qualifications submitted for this Contract must use the template attached to this Request for Qualifications as Exhibit B, and must be certified under penalty of perjury by the design-build entity and its general partners or joint venture members.

The following non-price-related factors will be considered by the District when evaluating qualifications: Technical design and construction expertise, acceptability of safety record, possession of valid design professional (i.e., California registered architect or engineer) and contractor licenses (including a Class "B" California contractor license).

A design-build entity shall not be prequalified or short-listed unless the entity provides an enforceable commitment to the District that **the design-build entity and its subcontractors at every tier will use a skilled and trained workforce** to perform all work on the Contract that falls within an apprenticeable occupation in the building and construction trades, pursuant to Education Code section 17250.25(c).

SKILLED AND TRAINED WORKFORCE REQUIREMENTS:

The school district has entered into a Project Labor Agreement that will bind all contractors and subcontractors performing work on the Project, and the DBE must agree to be bound by that Project Labor Agreement.

Project Labor Agreement shall apply to labor performed at the project site and not for labor performed at the design-build entity's off-site manufacturing facility.
