## What is the Lummi Johnson O'Malley Program?

The Lummi Johnson O'Malley Program offers supplemental services to assist in meeting the unique and specialized needs of eligible JOM Indigenous youth from ages 3 through 12th grade, that are enrolled in the Lummi and Ferndale School Districts, as well as other Lummi enrolled members in outlying accredited educational institutions. These services are to encourage and maintain educational growth.

## JOM Eligibility Requirements

To be eligible for JOM services, students must be:

- At least ¼ degree Indian blood, OR an enrolled member of a federally recognized tribe/ Alaskan Native (must provide proof of enrollment, CIB, letter from tribal enrollment office)
- Age 3 through 12<sup>th</sup> grade
- Enrolled in Lummi Nation School K-12 or Ferndale School District, or Lummi enrolled student attending an outlying accredited institute.

- Tutoring
- Funding Assistance
- School Supply Assistance
- Graduation Incentives
- Transportation (upon availability)
- Academic Enrichment Opportunities
- Career/College Preparedness Opportunities
- Cultural Enrichment Activities

## Parent Advisory Committee (PAC) Meetings

## On-Site Tutoring Services

## Transportation
