Dear Parent/Guardian,

In order to prepare students to make healthy and responsible decisions as they grow and develop through adolescence, your student's class will be studying the physical, social, and emotional changes associated with human growth and development. Human growth and development education is part of a balanced, complete health education program. The goals of this unit are to help students:

- Gain accurate and age-appropriate knowledge about adolescence;
- Develop a positive self-image and attitude towards the changes that they are experiencing or will experience;
- Develop skills that will enable them to communicate appropriately with others;
- Learn about HIV/AIDS, which addresses the national concern regarding this communicable disease.

Topics that will be covered include the social, emotional, and physical changes associated with puberty, development of the male and female reproductive systems, menstruation, personal safety and decision- making, and HIV/AIDS.

*Students at North Lake Middle School will be completing the human growth and development unit when they rotate through their week-long health classes from May 6 to May 31, 2024.*
