March Character Trait--COOPERATION


During the month of March, we have had a school-wide focus on Cooperation. Cooperation is working together to reach shared goals.

The Sams Valley Community Carnival--Coming May 17th


GET INVOLVED--We SERIOUSLY need your help!



A Message from the School Nurse--Angela Parker

You have probably noticed that it takes a very long time on a waiting list to get a primary care provider. As our valley becomes more populated and providers have become fewer and fewer, our access to healthcare is challenged. La Clinica School nurses are placed in the schools to serve the school families and try to bridge this gap. At the same time, many parents cannot leave work to take their child to a provider visit. A single child can become sick several times a year and when this is multiplied by a few kids, it can become difficult to make it to the office visits.

This is where our Telehealth system can be extremely helpful. When an illness/injury such as an earache, sore throat, swollen glands cut, scrape, sprang, infections, cough, pink eye, headache, allergies, rash, head injury, etc. happen, the parents can have the option of a virtual telehealth visit from the school.

With proper consent, the child can come to the School Based Health Center located within your school, and the nurse they are familiar with can assist with an office visit. This visit is in real time with a local La Clinica school-based provider through the video system. The parent or guardians are invited to join in person or by video chat on their phone. No travel time is needed, and the child can go back to class after the office visit. If a medication is needed, the provider will send in the script, and it can be picked up from your pharmacy on the way home from work all in the same day. This is a "game changer" for the schools who have been operating with only a nurse and for schools in rural areas.

Bus Transportation--Ride 360 App

RIDE 360 is a website and cell phone app that allows parents to access their child's school bus number, drop off and pick up locations and times confidentially. As students move in or out of our schools, add bussing or new routes are created, RIDE 360 will keep parents up-to-date on any bus time changes. Traversa also provides the Transportation Department the ability to alert parents about weather delays, school cancelations and if the school bus is running late.

We encourage ALL parents of students that ride a bus to or from school to download the app and/or website guidebooks below to learn how to begin using this new software as soon as possible.
