

New York State Seal of Biliteracy The What, Why, and How of the Process

The NYS Seal of Biliteracy (NYSSB) is an award that recognizes students who have studied and attained proficiency in two or more world languages (one of which must be English) by high school graduation. The NYSSB carries the highest weight on a school's "readiness measures" on the ESSA Accountability score. The weighting aligns with the NYS Regents with Advanced Designation, Advanced Placement, and International Baccalaureate exams.
