Dear Parents/Guardians:

The Commonwealth of Pennsylvania requires all school districts to administer the Pennsylvania System of School Assessment (PSSA). The PSSA is the annual standards-based assessment used to measure a student's attainment of the Pennsylvania Academic Standards in English-Language Arts (ELA), Mathematics, and Science.

Students in grades 3-8 for the 2023-2024 school year will automatically take designated PSSAs.

The Pennsylvania Department of Education has determined that the PSSA testing window is from April 22 to May 10, 2024. The District has thoughtfully considered the schedule to ensure that students observing Passover can participate in the tests without interfering with the state-provided testing dates. Testing will commence on April 24th in our elementary and middle schools. Your child's school principal will provide specific assessment schedules regarding the times of each assessment.

Chapter 4 of Title 22 of PA. Code (22 PA. Code 4.4) provides for the right of any parent/guardian to excuse their child from the state assessment if, upon inspection of the testing materials, they find the assessment to conflict with religious beliefs. This is the only reason the state allows students to opt out of an assessment.

Parents and guardians may review the PSSA materials by making arrangements with the school principal after the exams arrive on April 10, 2024. Parents/guardians must sign the Parent Confidentiality Agreement before examining test materials. A record of the agreement will be kept at the school.

If you opt your child out of taking one or more PSSAs, parents/guardians must review the test materials and provide a written request addressed to the superintendent and delivered to the principal. Please note you must submit a separate request for each child you request to be excluded.

Assessment scores represent a snapshot of student performance and should not be considered the sole indicator of student achievement. Data obtained from each assessment serves as only one tool for planning school programs, designing curriculum and instruction, and providing information to the public.

Parents may help their children prepare for the assessments by encouraging them to get plenty of rest the night before testing and have a good breakfast on the mornings of the test.
