OFFICE INFORMATION

Park School is committed to providing a safe and secure environment for all students. This section highlights expectations and procedures that will allow us to provide it.

The student drop-off and pick-up area is at the bottom of the hill. Please do NOT drive up the hill to drop off or pick up your student, <u>before or after school</u>. Our driveways and parking areas are not large enough to support that many vehicles. We appreciate your cooperation!

Arrival

Students may arrive at school no earlier than 7:30 a.m. Supervision will not occur until that time. If you arrive earlier, you <u>must remain with your child until adult crossing guards are</u> <u>present</u>. Please only use the marked crosswalks that are monitored by crossing guards and remember, <u>U-TURNS are unsafe and NOT ALLOWED</u> in the drop-off/pick-up area.

Upon arrival at school, all students should walk up the hill and remain on the lower-level playground until the bell rings for the start of the school day. Students eating breakfast at school can do so between 7:35-8:00 a.m. and should enter the school through the front doors. If your child rides a bike or scooter to school, it will need to be stored/locked up in the bike rack at the bottom of the hill.

Dismissal

Dismissal begins at 3:50 p.m. each day and 12:00 p.m. on early release days. In order to maximize instructional time and maintain a safe orderly dismissal, any changes to transportation or pick-up arrangements must be communicated to the front office no later than 3:00 p.m. (11:00 a.m. on early release days). Dismissal arrangements may be communicated via phone or written note. Student messages are delivered at 3:30 p.m. We cannot guarantee changes after that time. The best practice is to always make sure your child knows his/her after school plans each morning before leaving home.

Attendance

If your child is going to be absent or tardy, please notify the office before 8:30 a.m. It is important for office staff to account for each child as soon as possible. Students who are unaccounted for are marked as an unexcused absence until parent communication is received.

In order to provide an opportunity for your child to learn, we need him/her at school. It is our expectation that all students be present for a minimum of 90% of our scheduled instructional days. If students are absent due to illness or appointments, please provide a doctor's note upon your return to school.

Withdrawal of Students

If your child must withdraw from Park School, please notify the office and your child's teacher at least 3 days in advance. This will allow time to complete checkout procedures and ensure that your student has all of their belongings. Please take care to see that all school property has been returned and lunch balances have been paid.

POLICIES AND PROCEDURES

Park Families - this is a short list and synopsis of a few WSD policies that might be of interest to you. Please visit the Weiser School District Web Page for a more detailed description of each one or reach out to the Park Office for guidance. We appreciate your understanding and cooperation with these school board approved policies.

STUDENTS 3255: Student Dress - Appropriate student dress and appearance is essential to a positive learning environment. We trust that parents will ensure their children are dressed appropriately for school and weather conditions. Students are expected to take pride in their dress, grooming, and general appearance, which should not distract from or impede the learning of themselves or others. Head coverings, make-up, gum and other accessories are prohibited unless approved for a school-wide dress up day. Further, please ensure your students have appropriate footwear for P.E. * Please see next page for a visual guide to appropriate student dress.

INCLEMENT WEATHER

Inclement weather is a reality during the school day. We trust that families will ensure children are dressed appropriately for the weather. It is our responsibility to check weather conditions prior to sending students to recess. If temperatures are below 10 degrees (including wind chill) and/or raining steadily, students will remain inside for recess.

STUDENTS 3265: Student-Owned Electronic Communications Devices - Access to the devices is a privilege and not a right. Each student will be required to follow the Acceptable Use of Electronic Networks Policy and the Internet Access Conduct Agreement. Personal devices cannot be used during school hours unless authorized by the teacher or principal. Furthermore, students are responsible for safeguarding devices they bring to school. The District shall not be responsible for loss, theft, unauthorized use of, damages, or destruction of student owned devices brought onto school property. * Please do not encourage your student to communicate on their devices during school hours.

STUDENTS 3270: District Provided Access to Electronic Information, Services, and Networks - Each student and his or her parent(s)/legal guardian(s) will be required to sign and return to the school at the beginning of each school year the *Internet Access Conduct Agreement* prior to having access to the District's computer system and/or internet service.





IMPORTANT ODDS & ENDS

<u>Visitors</u> - It is **mandatory** for all visitors to check in at the Office, sign in on the Visitor's Log, and obtain a name tag prior to entering the halls. We appreciate that many of our families have lived in Weiser for a long time and are familiar faces in our community. However, we must keep in mind that we have new staff and students each year. Thank you for signing in and for keeping safety a priority at Park School.

<u>Volunteers</u> - If you wish to volunteer at Park School, a Volunteer Registration Form must be completed and approved prior to the event. Please contact the Park School Office for more information.

<u>Food Services</u> - The cafeteria serves a well-balanced meal twice a day. Breakfast is served each morning from 7:35-8:00 a.m. Lunch is served from 12:05-12:45 pm (4th) and 12:20-1:00 pm (5th). Parents are welcome to eat lunch at school with their student. If you would like to have lunch with your child, please call the office that morning. Meal prices can be found on the district website or by contacting the Park School Office.

<u>Library</u> - Students are encouraged to use the library regularly for recreational and academic reading. A student may check out two books per visit to the library, which may be checked out for two weeks, and renewed once. When checking out a book, the student assumes responsibility for that book. A student's privilege to check out books will cease if he/she has any overdue or missing books. Books that have been damaged beyond repair or lost may incur a fine, which must be resolved before the student has access to check out books again. In some cases, report cards will also be withheld. Parent notification regarding overdue or missing books will be sent home on Wednesdays.

<u>Flowers, Gifts, and Balloons</u> - On occasion, we receive flowers, gifts, or balloons for students from parents or relatives to be delivered at school. Please be aware that these items will be distributed at the end of the school day and that balloons are not allowed on our school district buses.

<u>School Parties</u> - Each classroom teacher holds class parties during the school year. These are usually held at Halloween, Christmas, and Valentine's Day. Birthday treats are also welcome at Park School. Each teacher will determine the best time of day for birthday treats based on their individual class schedules. Please note that for all parties and celebrations, food items must be prepackaged. Unfortunately, due to allergies and dietary restrictions, <u>homemade treats are not permitted at Park School</u>.

<u>Toys</u> - We understand that students may want to bring their favorite toy to school, however, toys can become a distraction to your student and others. Please do not send toys with your child to school.

Pets - Due to allergy and safety issues, cats, dogs, and other pets may not be brought to school without prior permission from the classroom teacher and the principal.

Title 1-A Parent Notification for Teacher Qualifications

Regarding the Right to Receive Teacher Information

- What is the college major of my child's teacher(s)?
- What degree or degrees doe
- s my child's teacher(s) hold?
- To request the state qualifications for any of your child's teacher(s) and/or paraprofessional(s), please contact the school office.
- If you would like more information about the school's Title I-A program, feel free to contact us.

You will be notified if your child is being taught by a teacher over four or more consecutive weeks who does not meet state licensure requirements for the teaching assignment.

PARENT INVOLVEMENT PLAN

In addition to the School-Parent Compact, we are dedicated to growing our partnership with parents and families.

Student Planners: ALL teachers will consistently use/check planners in classrooms to share information about student learning, as well as communicate with families about behavior. The planner also provides a way for families to communicate with the teacher. Please check your child's planner daily.

Wednesday Communications: We know that families are busy. With this in mind, newsletters and notes from the office, community, or classroom will come home on Wednesdays. This allows families to pinpoint a day each week for regular communication between school and home. Please remember to check your child's backpack every Wednesday.

When you Have a Concern: Please keep in mind that our teachers are here to partner with families to meet the needs of our students. If you have concerns or questions, please seek out your child's teacher first. Teachers can be reached by phone or via email from 7:45-4:20 Monday - Thursday. During instructional time, our front office staff will gladly take a message for you.

Report Cards and Conferences: Every 9 weeks a report card will be completed for each student. Report cards will be sent home with students or given to families during conferences, which will occur at least twice during the year. In accordance with Idaho assessment requirements for IRI, ISAT, and WIDA; student achievement reports will be provided to parents along with their student's report card. These will be provided by mail and sent no later than June 15th. Parents and teachers are encouraged to schedule additional conferences whenever needed to support student growth and learning.

Newsletter, Website and Facebook: Our Park School Newsletter is sent weekly to the email on file. It will contain a wealth of school information as well as fun happenings here at Park School.
