2024/25 IMMUNIZATION CHECKLIST

High school registration is not complete until your child has completed required examinations, immunizations and health screenings.

High school students need:

Students entering 9th grade need a health exam/physical within one year of starting school or when entering the IL school system for the first time.

Immunizations: Students must show proof of basic immunizations and required boosters for:

An oral health/dental exam before May 15 during their ninth grade school year.

Students entering grades 10, 11, or 12 need a sports physical if participating in sports. Sports physicals are good for 13 months and DO NOT replace the required ninth grade physical.

ALL INCOMING 12TH GRADERS MUST SHOW PROOF OF MENINGOCOCCAL VACCINE AFTER AGE 16.

Objections: Parents/guardians who object to required examinations or immunizations must submit an Illinois Certificate of Religious Exemption from their doctor's office.
