Master Planning/Boundaries Subcommittee Minutes

Board Members Present: Chair Kim Kenne, Patrick Cahalan, Michelle Bailey

Staff: Dr. Leslie Barnes

Call to Order: Chair Kim Kenne at 3:35 pm

Public Comment:

Bryant Mathews – Benefits of reducing number of schools Margaret Lee – Impact of choice missing in pros and cons

Approval of Minutes: The minutes of April 22, 2019, were approved. Mr. Cahalan moved and Ms. Bailey seconded.

DISCUSSION:

Brief Updates:

• Factors from Board Meeting

The factors will be brought to the full board on May 23. Chair Kenne will send out the list of choices for the board's review prior to approval.

• Final Davis Demographics Report

Mr. Cahalan pointed out that revisions to SPED and Out of District projections were not made from the first draft and Ms. Kenne asked staff if we could make our own projections. CBO Barnes said yes, they will be layered, and will talk to Scott Torlucci regarding SpEd revisions. Cleveland was removed but McKinley has no middle school zone. Does this need to be changed back? The maps show Blair and McKinley MS with the same attendance zone. Ms. Kenne asked if Torlucci could do a heat map, a visual of where students are living, both PUSD and non-PUSD students. Perhaps ITS can prepare same. Staff to request.

• Open Enrollment Results

Student's placements are not included. The subcommittee needs a complete report. Students should be flagged who enroll in the spring and don't show up in the fall. ITS can provide the percentage.

• Capacity Summary

Complete and accurate information is required regarding projected capacity – some items are still missing and some discrepancies exist. Ms. Kenne asked if a loading factor will be used for SDC classes. Mr. Cahalan suggested that a goal range of 85% be used rather than 90% to take into account other uncertainty about room availability as classroom space and the SDC loading factor. What are other infrastructure factors of a site that need to be used to determine maximum site capacity other than classroom capacity? The subcommittee needs a quick analysis of maximum capacity that all sites can handle taking those other factors into account. Staff to do this analysis and report back.

• IB Program Relocation

After reaching out to IB for information, Ms. Kenne stated that to move the program is less expensive and requires a shorter timeframe than was earlier reported. Ms. Bailey commented that it is expensive to move this program as the site must qualify and all teachers must be certified. Ms. Kenne reported that the only cost is the on-site inspection. She will research the issue further.

• Questions for Principals

Ms. Bailey created a list of questions which were circulated for discussion. Mr. Cahalan suggested adding the capacity study report, although Ms. Kenne felt that this might muddy the questions regarding programs. The subcommittee asked that the Academics division weigh in on asking the principals to respond to the questions, as the subcommittee has no authority to direct staff work. Ms. Kenne requested that the principals respond to the questions in writing ahead of time. Ms. Bailey felt that this would be too much work and should be for discussion guideline purposes only. Ms. Kenne will work with Academics for a solution.

• Webpage Documents

All documents are posted. Ms. Kenne will ask ITS if it is possible to develop a link where the public can add documents.

Secondary Scenarios - Pros/Cons

CBO Barnes presented ELT's work on the secondary pros/cons. The subcommittee asked that items which affect all sites be separated. The feeder system needs to be part of the conversation. Dr. Barnes stated that this was the first draft of the document, and that more information would be added later. Ms. Kenne requested that the items be organized first by primary factors, and then secondary. Mr. Cahalan suggested that the factors be discussed with the full board. Ms. Kenne asked what the facts versus assumptions are based upon and noted that there are few cons regarding keeping schools open. Mr. Cahalan suggested constructing a school model for all three levels (elementary, middle and high) with staffing to ratio costs, using projected enrollments and making adjustments. The next steps could be community town hall meetings in August after finalizing of the scenarios. The subcommittee should review all documents and provide input for going forward. The public can provide input to the subcommittee members for more pros and cons. Mr. Cahalan asked if the next subcommittee meeting on May 20 would include principals. He suggested outreach to the Pasadena City Counsel, Sierra Madre City Council, and Altadena Town Council in July, with perhaps a parent outreach in August. The subcommittee will get their feedback and input on the pros/cons back to ELT by May 28.

Public comment:

Jennifer Higginbotham – Scenario alignment with capacity Nancy Dufford – Include alternate scenarios for public input

On June 17, a meeting will be held to review all scenarios. The Muir D Building must reflect PCC's use in the capacity study.

Program – Core, Costs by Schools, Evaluation of Programs

Mr. Cahalan stated that costs must be differentiated per configuration when looking at a model school. Ms. Kenne asked if the costs were based on the budget or actuals. How do we communicate this? The costs of program level or per pupil – which is correct to look at? What is the takeaway? Is unduplicated count used for weighting? The current base staffing is not ideal. Mr. Cahalan suggested waiting before posting to adjust for unduplicated counts; post with context.

Hold June 3 at 4 p.m. for pros and cons conversation, maybe with principals.

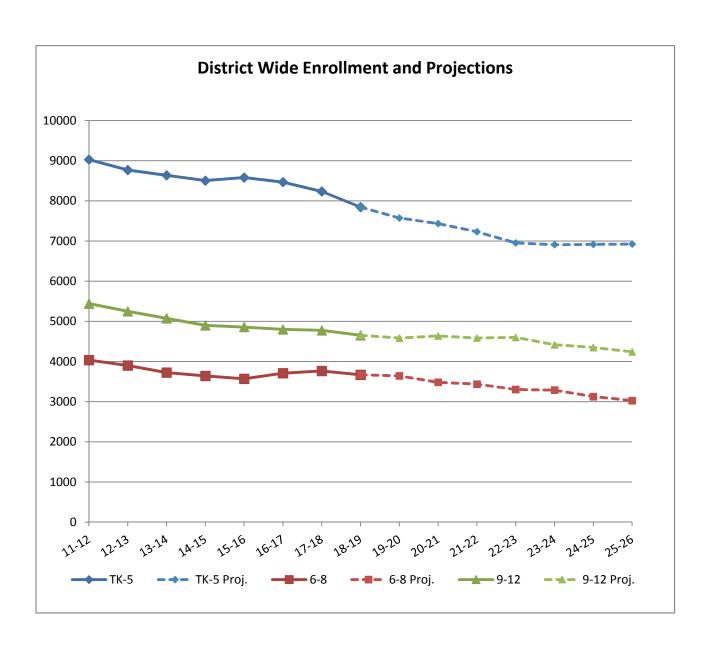
