


March Harmony Lessons

Students were able to use the following Teamwork Skills Chart whenever they were working together.

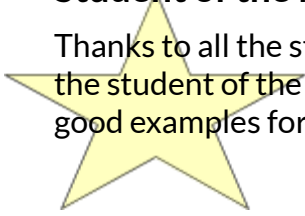
