the school district and a variety of stakeholders, such as students, parents, staff, community members, and local organizations. Throughout the past year, our department has forged partnerships with notable entities like the Cleveland Browns, The Cleveland Foodbank, Bedford Rotary Club and the Educational Equity Group.

Our department oversees five key areas: Career Technical Education, Communication, Registration and Enrollment, Social Emotional Learning (SEL), and Student Attendance and Welfare. Noteworthy achievements this academic year include our collaboration with the Cleveland Browns Stay In The Game initiative, which focuses on improving student attendance. Since joining forces with the Cleveland Browns and participating in their Stay In The Game program, BCSD has consistently maintained an attendance rate above 90%. Additionally, we have made significant strides in fully integrating career technical education into the curriculum at both middle and high school levels.

The district is dedicated to organizing family engagement events that bring together parents, students, stakeholders, and district employees for educational and enjoyable experiences. Examples of these events include the district's annual Autumn Fest, SEL Day, Juneteenth Celebration, Cavs Family Night, Civic Engagement Night, and CTE Nights during Career Technical Education month. Additionally, we involve our senior citizens' community in events like the Senior Prom, Valentines Dance, and Jazz Brunch.

Our primary aim is to keep students, parents, staff, and stakeholders informed about the exciting advancements and accomplishments within the Bedford City School District. Keep an eye out as our district advances, and you witness the groundbreaking of our new buildings.

As a graduate of the Bedford City School District, it is an honor and privilege to serve as the Executive Director of Human Capital, Equity and



Inclusion. In our department we have two main areas of focus. The first area of focus is to hire, recruit and retain the highest qualified, diverse, positive-minded candidates to fill our open positions (administrative, certificated, exempt, & classified) at 100% districtwide, in order to positively impact student achievement in math and reading leading to an increased graduation rate.

Our second area of focus is highlighted in the acronym **ACHIEVE**. **ACHIEVE** stands for: **A**cknowledge, **C**ulture, **H**istory, **I**nclusive, **E**quity, **V**alue, **E**veryone. We are committed to **ACHIEVE** the diverse needs of our students and staff, placing an emphasis on equity for our educational community. The decision making process along with our assistance and interventions will be reflective of research-based strategies and best practices, which align to the district's practices with regard to diversity, equity and inclusion.

In the office of Human Capital, Equity and Inclusion, we have action steps that we have been implementing this year. We effectively utilize our equity and inclusion team members for the welfare of our students. We are implementing the foundation of the **ACHIEVE** principles to enrich our inclusive views and enabling everyone to **ACHIEVE** to their highest potential. We have implemented and utilized the MTSS(multi-tiered support system) process, and continue to train all BCSD employees in Crisis Prevention Intervention known as CPI.

As a department and a district, we embrace the importance of learning and understand that students have multiple learning styles. We have the courage to push beyond what is comfortable. We also believe everyone has a story - learn theirs and share yours and we will strive to create spaces where there is unity and belonging for all, and we believe we are all in this together.

Executive Director of Operations

Since joining the amazing team at the Bedford City School District in May 2022, my number one priority has been to improve the conditions in which our



students learn every day. Our oldest school building was built when Theodore Roosevelt was President and our youngest was built during the Lyndon B. Johnson administration. It was obvious to me on my very first day that these aging facilities cannot meet the needs of 21st century students and must be replaced, in their entirety, as soon as possible.

The first step to this process was to restart the Master Facilities Planning Committee that was stalled during the pandemic. We hired a new architect, GPD Group, and worked with community and staff to develop a plan that will meet the needs of both the students of today and the next fifty years. The Board of Education voted to put the plan on the ballot in the form of a \$161 million bond issue, and with an amazing show of community support, we passed it on the very first try.

Over the past few months, we have kicked off the design process and have begun selection of our Construction Manager and we look forward to breaking ground on our new Middle School and PreK-2 buildings in the spring of 2025, with both buildings opening in 2027. Our new high school is slated to begin construction in the spring of 2026, opening in 2028. Our third through fifth grade students will be relocated to a renovated Heskett building until we receive our state share of construction dollars (almost \$33 million), which will fund the construction of a new 3rd-5th grade building.

This exciting process will transform the Bedford City School District community, providing state of the art educational facilities that meet modern standards of security, indoor air quality, technology and accessibility.

Executive Director of Academic Achievement

The Office of Academic Achievement works to ensure the district's goals are met. We strive to support the work at the district and building levels through the Ohio Improvement



Process. The work of school improvement is centered on the development, implementation and monitoring of the Three-Year Plans. We find by collaborating with the schools and supporting their specific strategies we can address gaps in learning. Therefore, a focus is placed on the performance of students, especially subgroups to gain insight on achievement gaps. As a result, we can be intentional on what we provide to continue moving the district ahead academically. Thus, in overseeing the development of the curriculum and instruction for Bedford City Schools we aim to support our teachers within their growth and development. Additionally, we seek to promote an attainable curriculum that is not only challenging but equitable.

Within the area of Federal Programs there is oversight for the Title I program. As well there is the management of Title 1D, Title I Non-Competitive, Title II and Title IV funds. Collaborative efforts between the Office of Academic Achievement and Title I funded buildings ensure that the federal funds that the buildings receive are used appropriately to support the needs of the buildings and students. These are highlighted by the usage funds for staffing, student supports, professional development opportunities, parent/family engagement and obtaining supplies/materials.

In understanding the importance placed on the district to show improvement there is also a recognition of the needs of our younger students. Therefore, our preschool programs have been instrumental in not only welcoming our PreK students into the school environment but also preparing them. Likewise, our Gifted Program continues to identify, guide and support our students performing at high levels. The efforts of our instructional coaches in the areas of data, literacy and mathematics allow for our administrators, teachers and staff to be exposed to training that informs and prepares them. Equally important, it allows for collegiality, which allows for learning to be the centerpiece of the district.

As we enter spring athletics, our baseball, softball, and track & field programs are poised for big seasons while both boys volleyball and girls flag football (both in their second years as programs) look to build on their successes from last season as well.
